The Ladies, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, before twelve o'clock, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's Command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations,

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be very distinctly written upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves 'at. Drawing Roors, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

A T the Council Chamber, Whilehall, the 12th day of March, 1877.

By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after this twelfth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and words in this Order have the same meaning as in The Animals Order of 1875.

2. Notwithstanding anything in The Cattle-Plague Order of 1877, or in any other Order of Council, the movement of cattle within the Parts of Holland, the Parts of Kesteven, and the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire, and within the Boroughs of Boston, Grantham, Grimsby, Lincoln, Louth, and Stamford, is hereby prohibited, except with a licence prescribed in that behalf by the Local Authority of the district where such cattle are: Provided as follows:

(1.) No cattle shall be moved out of the district in which they are, except with a licence of the Local Authority; and if that licence is not signed by a Justice of the Peace, then there shall also be requisite a licence of the Local Authority of the district into which they are to be moved, indorsed on or referring to such first-mentioned licence; but such secondly-mentioned licence is that not be necessary in the case of movement from lands to other lands in the same occupation, situate in the district into which the cattle are moved, within five hundred yards of the boundary of the district out of which they are moved: Provided that no licence for movement shall be available for movement into the district of any Local Authority, if such Local Authority have made a regulation wholly prohibiting such movement.

(2.) No licence shall be necessary for movement within the district for a distance not exceeding five hundred yards from lands to other lands in the same occupation.

3. If any cattle are moved in contravention of the provisions of this Order, the owner: thereof, and the person directing or permitting their removal, and the company or person removing or conveying them, shall each be deemed guilty of an offence against this Order.
