THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul and Agent-General at Cairo, stating that so long as cholera exists at Madras a quarantine of seven days at Gebel Torr will be imposed on all arrivals from Madras, where there has been a case of sickness or death from cholera on board, and that a quarantine of observation of 24 hours will be imposed in all other cases.
