Board of Trade (Harbour Department), Whitehall Gardens, March 15, 1877.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul and Agent-General at Cairo, stating that so long as cholera exists at Madras a quarantine of seven days at Gebel Torr will be imposed on all arrivals from Madras, where there has been a case of sickness or death from cholera on board, and that a quarantine of observation of 24 hours will be imposed in all other cases. In a subsequent Despatch the Consul and Agent-General states that where it can be properly certified that the state of health on board the Indian Packets continues good during the passage between Madras and Suez, no quarantine will be imposed upon them.
