THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a translation of a Spanish Royal Order requiring captains of vessels trading with Spain to declare in their manifests all packages containing woven goods, in a separate item for each package, with their respective marks, weight, and numeration. When such packages contain other articles besides woven goods, the manifest must in addition specify the quantity of the woven goods and the class of the other articles forming the remainder of the contents of the package. The Spanish Consuls have orders not to place their visa on any manifest which does not conform to the above regulations.

And whereas by "The Board of Trade Arbitrations, &c., Act, 1874," it is enacted, that where any difference to which a Railway or Canal Company is a party, is required or authorized under the provisions of any general or special Act passed either before or after the passing of this Act, to be referred to the arbitration of, or to be determined or settled by, the Board of Trade, the Board of Trade may, if they think fit, by order in writing under the hand of the President or one of the Secretaries of the Board, refer the matter to the decision of the Railway Commissioners, and appoint them arbitrators or umpire, as the case may be, and that thereupon the Commissioners for the time being shall have the same powers as if the matter had been referred to their decision in pursuance of "The Regulation of Railways Act, 1873," and also any further powers which the Board of Trade, or an arbitrator or arbitrators or umpire appointed by the Board of Trade, would have had for the purpose of the arbitration, if the difference had not been referred to the Commissioners. And whereas complaints have been made by the Wilts, Somerset, and Berks Canal Traders' Association to the Lords of the said Committee, otherwise the Board of Trade, that the amount of the rates or tolls receivable or claimable by the said Railway Company by virtue of "The Great Western Railway Act, 1852, No. 1," and the said therein recited Acts, for or in respect of the said

canal and parts thereof, and of the several vessels, articles, matters, and things which are navigated, carried, and conveyed in, upon, and along the same and parts thereof, is such as, with reference to the rates and tolls taken and carriage charged upon the said railway, to operate prejudicially to the persons using the canal. And whereas the Board of Trade have, by Order in writing under the hand of one of their Secretaries, dated the fifth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, referred the said matters of complaint to the decision of us, the Railway Commissioners, and appointed us arbitrators.

Now we, having duly heard the Wilts, Somerset, and Berks Canal Traders' Association, and the Great Western Railway Company by their counsel and witnesses, and examined and enquired into the said complaints and the grounds thereof, and having duly had regard to the tolls levied on the said railway and the tolls which it is lawful to levy on the said canal, do hereby make the following regulations:—

1. On and after the first day of April next, the rates and tolls which shall be received and claimable by the said Railway Company for and in respect of coals, coke, and culm, stone (ashlar block, Bath stone, bricks, paving, and stone for cement, pitching, range, and rough wall), and tiles, passing upon the said Kennet and Avon Canal, or any part thereof, shall be one halfpenny per ton per mile, and so in proportion for any greater or less quantity than a ton, or greater or less distance than a mile, not to exceed for the whole line of the canal, or any part thereof, one shilling and four pence per ton, and for and in respect of empty bottles and packages, flour, grain, iron of all kinds, malt, meal, malingany, ores of all metals, salt, slates, and timber of all kinds passing upon the said canal, or any part thereof, one halfpenny per ton per mile, and so in proportion for any greater or less quantity than a ton, or greater or less distance than a mile, not to exceed for the whole line of the canal, or any part thereof, two-shillings per ton.
2. The said rates and tolls shall apply to the tolls mentioned in section 14 of the said Act, so far as relates to the articles above specified.
3. The Regulation numbered one, published in the London Gazette of the fifth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, shall on and from the first day of April next, cease to apply to the articles, rates, and tolls mentioned in the first and second of these Regulations.
4. The Regulation numbered two, published in the London Gazette of the fifth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, shall extend to the articles, rates, and tolls mentioned in the first and second of these Regulations.
