REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, before twelve o'clock, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is

Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be very distinctly written upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at one o'clock.

THE Secretary of State for War, with the concurrence of the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, hereby gives notice that the following situation in the War Office is withdrawn from Schedule A, and is added to Schedule B, of the Order in Council of 4th June, 1870, viz.:-The situation of Temporary Assistant Chemist.

Vicar's Rate in Halifax Act, 1877. WHEREAS it is provided by the 3rd and 4th sections of the Vicar's Rate in Halifax Act.

1877, that the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England shall receive from any person or persons willing to pay the same in one sum, the amount of eleven thousand two hundred pounds by way of commutation money for the sum of nine hundred and twenty-seven pounds eight shillings and four pence, payable in lieu of mortuaries, Easter and other dues, and charged on inhabited houses, with orchards and gardens (if any) locally attached thereto, and occupied therewith, and situate in the twenty townships (excluding Sowerby), specified in the schedule referred to in the said Act; and that whenever the said Commissioners certify to one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State that the said sum of eleven thousand two hundred pounds has been paid to them as aforesaid, the said Secretary of State shall give notice thereof in the parish of Halifax in such manner as he thinks fit, and on and after the date of such notice the right of the churchwardens of the said twenty townships mentioned in the said schedule to assess, raise, or charge in all or any of the said twenty townships all or any of the said sum of nine hundred and twenty-seven pounds eight shillings and four pence, or any contribution thereto, shall be deemed to have ceased and to cease on and after the first day of May then next preceding, and all the said townships and the inhabited houses situate in the said townships, with the orchards and gardens (if any) locally attached thereto and occupied therewith, shall be deemed to have been free and to be free from such charge of nine hundred and twenty-seven pounds eight shillings and four pence, and from every part thereof, and from all contribution thereto. And whereas the said Commissioners did, on the twenty-sixth day of April last, certify to me, that the said sum of eleven thousand two hundred pounds had been paid to them under and for the purposes of the 3rd section of the said Act.

Now, I hereby give notice accordingly, that the right of the churchwardens of the said twenty townships mentioned in the schedule to the said Act to assess, raise, or charge in all or any of the said twenty townships all or any part of the said sum of nine hundred and twenty-seven pounds eight shillings and four pence, or any contribution thereto, did cease and determine on the first day of May instant, and that from that date the inhabited houses situate in the said townships, with the orchards and gardens (if any) locally attached thereto, and occupied therewith, shall be deemed to have been free, on and after such first day of May instant, from such charge of nine hundred and twenty-seven pounds eight shillings and four pence, and from every part thereof, and from

all contribution thereto.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Officers' Securities: Altering provisions of General Accounts Order of 14th January, 1867, as regards Auditors' Reports:—

To the Auditors of the several Audit Districts named in the Schedule A to this Order;—

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Unions named in the Schedule B to this Order;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by a General Order of the Poor Law Board bearing date the 14th day of

January, 1867, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the several Unions named in the Schedule thereunto annexed, the Poor Law Board made certain regulations as to the keeping and auditing of the Accounts of the Guardians and their Officers, and the examination by the Auditor of the securities of such Officers;

And whereas it is required by Art. 51 of the said Order that the Auditor shall, at the close of every audit of the Accounts of the Union next after the 25th day of March in every year, transmit to the Poor Law Board a certain statement in reference to the Securities of Officers, and deliver a copy thereof to the Board of Guardians;

And whereas it is expedient that the Article above cited should be rescinded, and other provisions made as hereinafter set forth:—

Now therefore, we, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby order as follows:

ARTICLE I.—The Article numbered 51 in the above-recited General Order is hereby rescinded.

ARTICLE II.—The Auditor shall, at the close of every audit of the Accounts of the Union next after the 25th day of March in every year, transmit to the Guardians a statement in the Form in the Schedule G to the above-recited General Order, setting forth the name, of each Union Officer, Collector of Poor Rates, Vestry Clerk, and other Officer in the Union required to give security, and whether such security, together with any certificate or proof that each of the sureties therein named is living, and is not bankrupt or insolvent, was produced to him at such Audit, or the security is otherwise in force; and also in the column headed "Observations," stating any defects which he may discover in such securities.
