SOUTH COAST—SPENCER GULF.

(1.) *Intended Alteration in Tipara Reef Light.*

THE Government of South Australia has given notice, that on or about 1st June, 1877; a light will be exhibited from an iron pile structure on Tipara Reef.

The light will be a revolving white light of the first order, showing a bright flash every thirty seconds, and elevated 100 feet above high water.

Also, that the light-vessel on Tipara Reef, now showing a fixed light, will be withdrawn on the exhibition of the above revolving light.

EAST COAST—PORT JACKSON.

(2.) *Storm Signals at Sow and Pigs Light-vessel and Bradley Head.*

The Government of New South Wales has given notice, that the signal indicating an approaching southerly gale will be shown at Sow and Pigs light-vessel and Bradley Head, in the same manner that it is at present shown from South Head, Port Jackson.

TASMANIA—BANKS STRAIT.

(3.) *Shoal in Mussel Bay.*

Information has been received from Staff Commander Henry Stanley, R.N., in charge of Admiralty Survey, of the existence of a shoal in Mussel Bay, north-east coast of Tasmania.

This shoal (Cockle Bank) has 19 feet over it at low water, and bears W.N.W. from Rocky Head, distant 2 miles.
