"I AM informed officially by the Turkish Government that torpedoes having been placed in the Bay of Suda, in Crete, the entrance to it at night has been prohibited to all vessels of war and of commerce. No guns must be fired by vessels on their arrival at night. A Turkish man-of-war is on guard at the entrance."

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul-General in Egypt, stating that in consequence of the frequent cases that have occurred at Suez of vessels arriving there without bills of health, the Egyptian Board of Health have resolved that any vessel arriving at an Egyptian port from any place where epidemic disease exists, or is suspected to exist, unfurnished with a bill of health, and having no properly qualified surgeon on board, will be subjected to three full days' quarantine: Provided always, the voyage exceeds nine days.

The Consul-General adds that by a previous regulation, which remains in force, any vessel arriving from a suspected or infected place without a bill of health, but with a qualified surgeon on board, is subjected to a quarantine of 24 hours of observation.
