THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Decree of the Government of Guatemala, prohibiting the importation into the Republic by private individuals of wines, spirits, and other intoxicating liquors. As regards importations from Europe, the prohibition will not take effect till the 1st January, 1878.

From the 1st July, 1878, the trade in foreign wines and liquors will be a strict Government monopoly, their transfer by sale within the Republic, as well as their introduction, whether in large or small quantities, being prohibited to private persons.
