**REGULATIONS AS TO WEARING MEDALS, &c.**

HER Majesty has approved of the following Regulations for the Navy:—

1. Decorations and Medals are to be worn in Full Dress.

2. Miniature Orders and Medals, or Ribands only, may only be worn by Officers in the Undress Uniform.

3. Decorations and Medals are to be worn on the left breast, in a single horizontal line, suspended from a single bar, placed on a line one inch below the point of the shoulder, but no part of the bar or buckle is to be seen.

The buckle of the Companionship of the Bath, however, being part of the decoration, is to be shown.

The Riband is not to exceed one inch in length, unless the number of clasps requires it to be longer.

4. When the Decorations and Medals cannot, on account of the number, be suspended from the bar so as to be fully seen, they are to overlap.

5. Medals will be worn in the order of the dates on which they were conferred, the first Decoration or Medal obtained being placed farthest from the shoulder.

The following is the order of arrangement:—

1. English Decorations.
2. English Medals.
3. Foreign Decorations.
4. Foreign Medals.

The Medal for long service and good conduct is to be worn after the War Medal.

6. Medals granted to Petty Officers and Seamen may either be worn as indicated in the foregoing paragraphs, or be stitched in a straight horizontal line on the jacket or frock.

7. When Ribands only are worn, they must be half-an-inch in length.

8. Medals awarded by a Society for bravery in saving human life are, if specially authorized, to be worn on the right breast.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS (Supplementary to the General Regulations issued 8th April, 1872, and amended by subsequent Notices in the London Gazette,) respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the situation of Assistant-Surveyors in the Office of Her Majesty's Works, &c.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

The limits of age for this situation are 20 and 30, and candidates must be of the prescribed

age on the first day of the competitive examination.

II. Candidates will be required to show what preliminary training in their profession of Architect and Surveyor they have undergone to qualify themselves for a situation of this nature, and they must produce evidence on this point before they can be admitted to the examination. If this evidence should prove *prima facie* satisfactory, the applicants will be allowed to compete; but further proof will, if necessary, be required from the successful candidate.

III. The examination will be in the following subjects, viz. :—

1. Architecture and Principles of Construction.
2. Knowledge of Materials.
3. Designs and Specifications.
4. Estimating and Valuing.
5. Drainage and Water Supply.
6. Architectural Drawing.
7. Calculation of the strength of girders, roofs (iron and wood), stability of walls, and pressure and flow of water.
8. Levelling and Chain Surveying.
9. Engineering Drawing.
10. Rudimentary Chemistry and Physics.

Candidates must pass to the satisfaction of the Commissioners in the subjects numbered 1 to 7. The three remaining subjects are optional.

IV. No candidate can be admitted to the competition who has not previously satisfied the Civil Service Commissioners that he possesses the requisite amount of proficiency in the following subjects :—

1. Handwriting.
2. Orthography.
3. Arithmetic (to Vulgar and Decimal Fractions).

With this view, preliminary examinations in these subjects will be held at such times and places as the Commissioners may appoint.

V. Application for permission to attend a preliminary examination must be made in the writing of the candidate at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Commissioners.

VI. A fee of 10s. will be required from every candidate attending a preliminary examination, and a further fee of £2 from every candidate who may be admitted to the competition.

## SOLDIERS' BALANCES UNCLAIMED.

IN pursuance of the "Regimental Debts Act, 1863," notice is hereby given, that Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department has available, for distribution amongst the Next of Kin or others entitled, the sum of money set opposite to the name of each of the deceased soldiers named in the list which is published with this notice in the London Gazette, and the "Army List," and is also to be seen at the Quarters of the several Staff Officers for the Pension Service throughout the United Kingdom.

Applications from persons supposing themselves entitled as Next of Kin should be addressed by letter to "The Under-Secretary of State, War Office, London, S.W.," and marked outside "Soldier's Effects."

No application can be attended to which does not state the date and place of the soldier's birth, enlistment, and death, and the name of his regiment; his regimental number should also be stated if known.

Should these particulars furnished by the applicant not agree with the facts recorded on the War Office documents relating to the deceased soldier, the applicant will be so informed; but should they agree therewith, then within three calendar months the Secretary of State will furnish the applicant with the usual requirements needed for the proof of the alleged relationship.

The application must be authenticated by the signature of the applicant, and his name should be affixed in the presence of the clergyman, or one of the churchwardens of the parish, or a Justice of the Peace; the applicant's address, with the name of the post town, must also be clearly stated. No personal application can receive attention.

Further lists will from time to time be published, and therefore it will facilitate the applicant's inquiries to give the number and date of the notice in which the deceased soldier's name appeared.—**EFFECTS, 1876-7.**

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter-mentioned, grant and convey to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Moreton Valence, in the county of Gloucester, and in the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage, all and singular the yearly tithe commutation rent-charges which are particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed, and are now vested in us: To have and to hold the said yearly tithe commutation rent-charges, subject as hereinafter mentioned, to the use of the said Incumbent and his successors for ever: Provided always, that the said yearly tithe commutation rent-charges expressed to be hereby granted and conveyed shall be, and be taken to be, in lieu of, and in full substitution for, the yearly sum or stipend of eleven pounds, heretofore payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage of Moreton Valence, under the authority of an Order of Her Majesty in Council, bearing date the twenty-third day of August, one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, and published in the London Gazette of the third day of October in the same year, and shall also be in lieu of, and in full substitution for, the further yearly sum or stipend of seventeen pounds fifteen shillings and one penny, heretofore payable by us, the said Commissioners, or by our lessee, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage, in respect of the said and other tithe commutation rent-charges and other hereditaments, to both of which substitutions the Reverend Robert Reveley, the present Incumbent of the said vicarage, is consenting, and in token thereof has signed this instrument: And provided also, that the Incumbent for the time being of the same vicarage shall be entitled to receive from us, or on our account, the net amount of the profits and proceeds of the said yearly tithe commutation rent-charges for and in respect of the period intervening between the fifteenth day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and the date of the publication of these presents in the London Gazette.

In witness whereof, we have hereunto set our common seal, this ninth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven.
