BOSTON FAIR.

IN pursuance of the above-mentioned Act, I,
the Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross,

one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of
State, hereby notify as follows:

1. By Memorial, dated the 31st August, 1877,
a representation has been duly made to me by the
Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough
and port of Boston, in the county of Lincoln, as
owners, that a Fair has been annually held in
the said borough on the 5th day of August in each
year, and that it would be for the convenience and
advantage of the public that the day for the hold-
ing of such Fair should be altered, and that, instead
of being held as aforesaid, such Fair should in
future be held on the first Wednesday in August
in each year.

2. On the 3rd day of October, 1877, I shall
take the aforesaid representation into considera-
tion, and all persons are to intimate, before that
day, any objection they may desire to offer to the
said proposed alteration in the time for holding the
said Fair.
