THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869, (in this Order referred to as the Act of 1869,) and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the tenth day of December,

one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven; and words in this Order have the same meaning as in the Act of 1869.

2. The Animals Order of 1875 shall be read and have effect as if Hull and South Shields were not named in Article 63, and Hull was not named in Article 71, of that Order, and after this Order takes effect foreign animals shall not be landed at either of those ports.

3. The Order described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby revoked.

4. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Orders, or either of them, before the date when this Order takes effect, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the said Orders, or either of them.
