**WYCLIFFE CHAPELYARD, STEPNEY.**—Forthwith in the chapelyard, except in vaults, each coffin buried in which shall be enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented, and except in family graves not less than five feet deep, which can be opened without the exposure of coffins or disturbance of remains.
