

each case by the respective ministers or incumbents for the time being when they shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act.

"And whereas the said four several sums of two thousand five hundred pounds of the four pounds per centum debenture stock of the Furness Railway Company aforesaid have been so provided as aforesaid upon the understanding that we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners should out of our Common Fund created by the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act pay to each of the ministers or incumbents for the time being of the said four proposed districts when duly licensed as aforesaid a grant of fifty pounds per annum, and upon the further understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of patronage of each of the said four districts and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent in each case should be assigned in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas we have agreed and undertaken to make each of the said four grants of fifty pounds per annum as aforesaid by an instrument or instruments to be executed by us under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and eleven.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Harvey Bishop of the said Diocese of Carlisle (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) We the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose:—

"Firstly that all those portions of the said new Parish of St. James Barrow in Furness and of the said new parish of Newbarns and Hawcoat which are described in the first schedule hereunder written (all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed and numbered 1) shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of St. Matthew Barrow-in-Furness.'

"Secondly that all that part of the said new parish of St. George Barrow which is described in the Second Schedule hereunder written (all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed and numbered 2) shall upon and from the day and date of the publication in the London Gazette of the Order as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of St. Mark Barrow-in-Furness.'

"Thirdly that all those portions of the said new parish of St. George Barrow and of the said parish of Dalton-in-Furness which are described in the third Schedule hereunder written (all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereto annexed and numbered 3) shall upon and from the day and date of the publication in the London Gazette of the Order as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of St. Luke Barrow-in-Furness:—and

"Fourthly that all that part of the said new parish of St. George Barrow which is described

in the forth Schedule hereunder written (all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed and numbered 4) shall upon and from the day and date of the publication in the London Gazette of the Order as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint John Barrow-in-Furness.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of each and of all of the said four proposed districts and of the nomination of the several ministers or incumbents thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly Gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised jointly by the Most Noble William Duke and Earl of Devonshire Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, the Most Noble Walter Francis Duke of Buccleuch and Queensbury Knight of the most Noble Order of the Garter, the Right Honorable Lord Frederick Charles Cavendish, a member of the Commons House of Parliament, Sir James Ramsden Knight and Henry William Schneider of Eaton-square in the County of Middlesex Esquire and their heirs and assigns for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or to any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

"The FIRST SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference:—

"The District of Saint Matthew Barrow-in-Furness being:—

"All that portion of the New Parish of Saint James Barrow-in-Furness in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Carlisle and also all those contiguous portions of the New Parish of Newbarns and Hawcoat in the same county and diocese which said portions of such new parishes are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the New Parish of Saint George Barrow in the said county and diocese from the New Parish of Saint James Barrow-in-Furness aforesaid at the point in the centre of Ramsden-square where Abbey-road is intersected by Duke-street and extending thence for a distance of nineteen chains or thereabouts first south-westward and then north-westward along the said boundary thereby following in the first named direction the middle of Abbey-road aforesaid and in the last-named direction the middle of Hindpool-road to the point where the last-named road is joined by North-road and where the same boundary bends sharply to the south-west and extending thence north-eastward and in a direct line for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts across the premises called or known as The Barrow Flax and Jute Works to the point where Back Duke-street South joins Nelson-street and continuing thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named street (thereby crossing Duke-street aforesaid) and along the middle of Drake-street to the junction of the last-named street with Holker-street and continuing thence still
