boundary is joined by the boundary dividing the said New Parish of Saint George Barrow from the New Parish of Saint James Barrow-in Furness aforesaid and extending thence southeastward along the last-mentioned boundary thereby passing between the graving dock and the entrance dock to the Devonshire Dock aforesaid to the first-described point in the middle of North-road aforesaid where the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the said new Parish of Saint James Barrow-in-Furness, of the said new Parish of Newbarns and Hawcoat, of the said new Parish of Saint George Barrow and of the said Parish of Dalton in Furness, out of some or one of which cures it is intended that the districts recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken.

And whereas the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said new Parish of Saint James Barrow-in-Furness, of the Vicarage of the said new Parish of Saint George Barrow, and of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Dalton-in-Furness and the incumbents of the said Vicarage of the new Parish of Saint George Barrow aforesaid and of the said Vicarage of the Parish of Dalton-in-Furness aforesaid have respectively signified their assent to the said Scheme.

And whereas the incumbent of the said Vicarage of the new Parish of Saint James' Barrow-in-Furness aforesaid and the patrons and the incumbent of the Vicarage of the said new Parish of Newbarns and Hawcoat have offered certain objections to the said Scheme.

And whereas the said Scheme has notwithstanding such objections been approved by Her Majesty in Council: Now therefore Her Majesty by and with the advice of Her said Council is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Carlisle.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty chapter one hundred and four duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the eighth day of November in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, in the words following that is

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen of the Act of the sixth

Crook Scar where the said last-mentioned and seventh years of your Majesty chapter boundary is joined by the boundary dividing thirty-seven and of the Act of the nineteenth the said New Parish of Saint George Barrow and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and four have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the Parish of Spalding and out of the parish of Pinchbeck and out of the Parish of Surfleet all situate in the County of Lincoln and in the Diocese of Lincoln.

"Whereas it has been [made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Spalding of the said Parish of Pinchbeck. and of the said Parish of Surfleet which are: hereinafter mentioned and decribed should be constituted a separate district in the manner hereinafter recommended and set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes

of Divine Worship.

"And whereas Charlotte Charinton of the said Parish of Spalding Spinster has contributed and transferred into our name in the books of the Governor and Company of the Bank of England the sum of three thousand three hundred and thirty-three pounds six shillings and eight-pence, three pounds per centum Consolidated Bank Annuities in aid of the endowment of the said proposed district and when such district shall have become a new parish under the provisions of the hereinbefore secondly mentioned Act then of such new parish and of the maintenance of the minister or incumbent thereof for the time being and we have agreed with the said Charlotte Charinton and have undertaken to pay to such minister or incumbent as aforesaid when duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the herein secondly mentioned Act and to his successors the annual dividends accruing upon the said sum of three thousand three hundred and thirty-three pounds six shillings and eight-pence three pounds per cen-tum Consolidated Bank Annuities so long as the said sum shall remain in our name in the books of the said Governor and Company.

"And whereas the said sum of three thousand three hundred and thirty-three pounds six shillings and eight-pence three pounds per centum Consolidated Bank Annuities has been so contributed and transferred as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that we should also make and pay out of the common fund created by the firstly hereinbefore mentioned. Act to the minister or incumbent of the said district or new parish, when duly licensed as before mentioned, a grant of fifty pounds per annum and upon the further undestanding that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of patronage of the said district or new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas we have undertaken and. agreed to make the said grant of fifty pounds per annum by an instrument to be executed by us under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of your Majesty chapter one

hundred and eleven.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Christopher Bishop of the said Diocese of Lincoln (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the
