

advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation or nomination to the said benefice of Melplaisch and the church thereof, now vested as aforesaid in the said George, Bishop of the said diocese of Salisbury, shall thereupon and thenceforth be assigned and transferred from him the said Bishop and from his successors in the same bishoprick and shall be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by

the said Edward Bagehot and his heirs and assigns for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy; of the Act of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five; and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Her Majesty, chapter eighty-two; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the sixth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, in the words and figures following; that is to say:—

“ We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty chapter seventy, of the Act of the eleven and twelfth years of your Majesty chapter thirty-seven, of the Act of

the fourteenth and fifteenth years of your Majesty chapter ninety-seven, of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter fifty-five, and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of your Majesty, chapter eighty-two have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of All Saints situate in Branksome Park in the new parish of Saint Peter Parkstone in the county of Dorset and in the diocese of Salisbury.

“ Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of Saint Peter Parkstone, and of the new parish of Saint Andrew, Kinson, in the said county of Dorset and in the said diocese of Salisbury which said extremities lie contiguous one to another and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such respective new parishes.

“ And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said new parish of Saint Peter, Parkstone, and of said new parish of Saint Andrew, Kinson should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes and that the same should be assigned to the said church of All Saints situate in Branksome Park as aforesaid.

“ Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend George Bishop of the said diocese of Salisbury as such Bishop with the consent of the Reverend John Parr, Clerk in Holy Orders now vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the parish of Saint Mary Marlborough in the said diocese of Salisbury, the patron of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Peter, Parkstone and with the consent of Sir Iror Bertie Guest of Canford Manor in the said county of Dorset, Baronet, the patron of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Andrew Kinson (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation)
