

the parsonage or house of residence belonging to the said united benefice of North Wheatley with Saundby and situate at North Wheatley aforesaid and that by the same Order in Council the yearly rent-charge in lieu of tithes belonging to the rectory of Saundby and amounting to £326 6s. 1d. shall be divided and apportioned so that there be assigned and attached to the said vicarage of North Wheatley the rent-charge of £155 10s. 2d. arising from the lands specified in the schedule hereunder written. And that it shall be provided by the said Order in Council that the remainder of the said rent-charge of £326 6s. 1d. amounting to £170 15s. 11d. and all other (if any) tithe rent charges, glebe lands endowments and emoluments belonging or reputed to belong to the said rectory of Saundby other than those so to be assigned and attached to the said vicarage of North Wheatley and also all such surplice fees Easter offerings and other emoluments usually payable to the incumbent of a parish or benefice as shall arise within or in respect of the rectory and parish of Saundby aforesaid shall continue to belong to the said rectory of Saundby. And that no apportionment shall be made of the sums of £14 8s. 6½d. for first fruits and £1 8s. 10½d. for tenths with which the said rectory of Saundby is now charged. And also that Henry Lord Middleton as patron of the said united benefice consents to such disunion and to the several matters and things above proposed as appears by an instrument in writing under his hand and hereinafter recited. And whereas the consent of the said Henry Lord Middleton as such patron as aforesaid to such disunion and to the several matters and things proposed in the said statement of the said Bishop was in the words following:—

*“Consent.”*

“I the Right Honourable Henry Lord Middleton the patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said benefice of North Wheatley with Saundby in the county of Nottingham and diocese of Lincoln do hereby signify my consent to the disunion of the rectory of Saundby from the vicarage of North Wheatley and to the several matters and things proposed in the annexed statement by the Lord Bishop of Lincoln.

“Given under my hand the 29th day of August in the year of our Lord 1877.

*“Middleton.”*

And whereas it thereupon appeared to the said Archbishop that the said union might be usefully dissolved and the said Archbishop did thereupon six weeks at least before certifying such enquiry to Her Majesty as in the said Act directed cause a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation to be affixed on the principal outer door of the church in each of the benefices forming part of the said united benefice with notice to any person or persons interested that he she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his her or their hands to the said Archbishop against any such disunion.

And whereas no sufficient cause was shown within the period limited by the said Act, and the said Archbishop did thereupon certify the enquiry and consent of the patron given as hereinbefore mentioned to Her Majesty in Council and did also recommend with the consent of the patron of the said united benefice (such consent being signified in writing as hereinbefore set forth under the hand of such patron) that there should be assigned and attached certain portions of the tithe, rent-

charges or other payments or compositions in lieu of tithes, glebe lands, and other endowments and emoluments belonging to or arising or accruing within the limits of such united benefice to each of such benefices respectively, which certificate and recommendation of the said Archbishop are in the words and figures following:—

“To the QUEEN’S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

“We the undersigned Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury Primate of all England and Metropolitan do hereby certify to your Majesty in Council.

“That the Right Reverend Christopher Lord Bishop of Lincoln as Bishop of the diocese within which is situated the united benefice consisting of the vicarage of North Wheatley and the rectory of Saundby in the county of Nottingham having represented unto us that the disunion of the said united benefice by the separation of the said rectory of Saundby from the said vicarage of North Wheatley might be made with advantage to the interests of religion we enquired into the circumstances of the case.

“That on such enquiry it appeared to us that such union might be usefully dissolved.

“That the Right Honourable Henry Lord Middleton is the patron or person entitled to present to the said united benefice if the same were now vacant and he consents to the proposed disunion.

“That six weeks and upwards before certifying such inquiry and consent to your Majesty in Council we caused a copy in writing of the said representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed to the principal outer door of each of the parish churches of the said united benefice with notice to any person or persons interested that he she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his her or their hand or hands to us the said Archbishop against such disunion and no such cause has been shown.

“The representation of the said Lord Bishop of Lincoln our inquiry into the circumstances of the case the reply thereto and the consent in writing of the patron and the copies of the representation and notice before referred to are herewith annexed.

“And we do hereby certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to your Majesty in Council to the intent that your Majesty in Council may in case your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for separating the said rectory of Saundby from the said vicarage of North Wheatley.

“And we recommend with the consent of the before named patron of the said united benefice (such consent being signified in writing under the hand of such patron) that it shall be provided by such Order in Council that all and singular the tithe rent-charges and other payments or compositions in lieu of tithes and all the glebe lands and other endowments and emoluments belonging or reputed to belong to the said vicarage of North Wheatley and also all such surplice fees Easter offerings and other emoluments usually payable to the incumbent of a parish or benefice as shall arise within or in respect of the said vicarage and parish of North Wheatley shall continue to belong to the said vicarage and the vicar thereof and that by the same Order in Council there shall be assigned and attached to the said vicarage of North
