In the London Bankruptcy Court.

In the Matter of Lewis Munro, of No. 3, Lime Tree-villas, Lordship-lane, Dulwich, in the county of Surrey, a Bankrupt.

Before Mr. Registrar Hazlitt, acting as Chief Judge.
