Www here a their Majefities have found Themfelves. obliged, for the nec. flory Defence and Safeguard of this Realm, and other Their Dominions, and the Vindicating and Preferving Their own and Their Subjects Rights, to Declare War agains the French King, and vigoroufly to Projecute the fame both by Sea and Land, and to jet out and employ Ships of War, and Land-Forces, for Reducing to Their Obedience the Kingdom of Ireland, at this time supported in Rebellion agains Their Majefites by the faid French King; Their Majefites putting Their Truft in Almitphy God (who bath mercifully and wonderfully preferved and blejled Their Majefites, bitherto, and this Kingdom by Their means ) That he will wouchfafe a special Blejing to this Their Righteous Undertaking, Do, by and with the Advice of Their Provy Council, hereby Appent and Command a General and Publick Fast and Hamiliation to be observed throughout this Kingdom, That fo both their Majefites and Their Subjects. Any humble themselves before Almighty God, in order to obtain Pardon for their Sins, and may in most devout and folem manner fend up their Prayers and Supplications to him, for Imploring his Blejing and Affitance on Their Majefites Arms, and Proferity to all Their Majefites Kingdoms and Dominions. Edinburgh, May 23. The Effates met this day, pursuant to their last Adjonrnment, and ordered a Proclamation to be Published, requiring the Attendance of all the ablent Members, before or on the 28th inftant, upon pain of Impriforment and being reputed Perfons difaffected to the Government, and proceeded against accordingly. An account was given to the Eftates of the Defeat of the Highlanders in Kintire (whereof mention was made in our last) and that several of the Chief of the Clans had fince acknowledged their. Fault, and offered a Submittion ; Whereupon it was ordered, That Captain Young, who commands, the Detachements fent that way, shall give fafe Conduct to fuch as shall make Application to him. for that purpole, to the end they may compear before the Effates at Edinburg, and afterwards re-turn, provided they come in before the 15th of the next Month. And that he difarm and dilate fuch perfons, as being thereunto required, will not concur in the Service of the Government.
