

Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-first day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, in the words and figures following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five; have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of All Saints, situate at Southport, in the parish of North Meols, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Chester.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of All Saints, situate at Southport as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend William, Bishop of the said diocese of Chester (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of North Meols which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of All Saints, situate at Southport as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of All Saints, Southport.'

"And with the like consent of the said William Bishop of the said diocese of Chester (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, should be solemnized or performed at such church, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of All Saints, Southport being:—

"All that part of the parish of North Meols in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Chester wherein the present incumbent of such parish now possesses the exclusive cure of souls which is bounded on the north-west by the boundary of the said parish on the shore of the Irish Sea on the south-west by the new parish of the Holy Trinity Southport within the original limits of the parish of North Meols aforesaid and upon all other sides that is to say on the south and on the north-east by an imaginary line com-

mencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Southport from the parish of North Meols aforesaid at the point at or near to the Blowick Station on the line of the Wigan and Southport Branch of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway where the said branch line of railway is crossed by Meols Cop-road and extending thence south-eastward along the northern side of the same branch line of railway for a distance of thirty-three chains or thereabouts to a boundary-stone inscribed 'S. A. S. D. C. 1878 No. 1' and placed on the northern side of the said railway and extending thence north-westward and in a direct line for a distance of twenty-eight chains or thereabouts to a boundary-stone inscribed 'S. A. S. D. C. 1878 No. 2' and placed on the southern side of Crowland-street at a distance of twenty-five chains or thereabouts (measured along the last-named street) to the north-east of the junction of the same street with Meols Cop-road aforesaid and continuing thence that is from the last-described boundary-stone still north-westward in precisely the same direction for a distance of thirty-seven chains or thereabouts to a boundary-stone inscribed 'S. A. S. D. C. 1878 No. 3' and placed on the south-eastern side on Bispham-road at a distance of seven chains and a quarter or thereabouts (measured along the last-named road) to the north-east of the junction of the same road with Long-lane and continuing thence that is from the last-described boundary-stone first north-westward to and then south-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of seven chains and a quarter or thereabouts to its junction with Long-lane, aforesaid and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of thirty-two chains or thereabouts to its junction with Roc-lane and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of eighteen chains and three-quarters or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the new line of the West Lancashire Railway Company and extending thence northward along the western side of the last-named line of railway for a distance of twelve chains and three-quarters or thereabouts to the fence on the northern side of Preston-road which forms the southern boundary of the premises of the Hesketh Park Railway Station and extending thence that is from the last-described point south-westward along the said fence (that is along the northern side of the said Preston-road and along the southern side of the same railway station premises) for a distance of forty-five yards or thereabouts to a boundary-stone inscribed 'S. A. S. D. C. 1878 No. 4' and placed at the south-western extremity of the said fence at a point distant ninety yards, measured in a direct line from the middle of the road called or known as Park-avenue and extending thence for a distance of forty-three chains and a half or thereabouts in curved lines which incline mainly towards the north-west and which are parallel to and distant exactly ninety yards to the east and north of the middle of the curvilinear roads called or known respectively as Park-avenue aforesaid and as Park-crescent to a boundary-stone inscribed 'S. A. S. D. C. 1878 No. 5' and placed at a point at the wall or fence forming the north-eastern boundary of the house and premises called or known as Fernholme and as No. 83 Albert-road such point being distant ninety yards (measured in the line of the said wall or fence) to the north-west of the junction of the said Albert-road with the road called or known as Park-crescent aforesaid and extending thence that is from the last-mentioned boundary-stone north-westward straight in the line of the same wall or
