THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Monte Video, stating that in consequence of the increase of yellow fever at Rio de Janeiro, all arrivals from Brazilian ports will be subjected to 21 days' quarantine from the date of arrival.
