PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the name be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in

order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under the circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1875 (38 Vic., c. 17):

WHEREAS by Section 68 of the above-named Act, it is provided as follows:—

“The Council of any Borough which is assessed to the county rate of any county by the Justices of such county, and the Commissioners of any Improvement District, may, by order of a Secretary of State made upon the application of such Council or Commissioners, and published in the London Gazette, be declared to be a Local Authority for the purposes of this Act, and thereupon shall become a Local Authority accordingly for such part of their borough or district as is not included in any harbour, to the exclusion of the Justices in Petty Sessions:”

And whereas an application has been made to me by the Town Council of the borough of Tynemouth to be declared a Local Authority for the purposes of the said Act, in accordance with the provision aforesaid.

Now I, the Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do hereby, in virtue of the powers contained in the said section, declare the said Town Council of the borough of Tynemouth, to be a Local Authority for the purposes of the said Act.

THE FAIRS ACT, 1873.

PETERBOROUGH FAIRS.

IN pursuance of the above-mentioned Act, I, the Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, hereby notify as follows:

1. A representation has been duly made to me by the Town Council of Peterborough, as owners, that Fairs have been annually held in that city, as follows, that is to say:—a Fair held on the 9th day of July, and two following days, known as “St. Peter's Fair,” and a Fair held on the 1st day of October, and two following days, known as “Bridge Fair,” and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the days for the holding of such Fairs should be altered, and that, instead of being held as aforesaid, such Fairs should in future be held as follows:—the Fair known as “St. Peter's Fair,” to be held on the second Tuesday and Wednesday in the month of July, and the Fair known as “Bridge Fair,” to be held on the first Tuesday, Wednesday, and

Thursday in the month of October, severally in each year.

2. On the 10th day of May, 1878, I shall take the aforesaid representation into consideration, and all persons are to intimate, before that day, any objection they may desire to offer to the said proposed alterations in the times for holding the said Fairs.
