A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, R.

**W**HEREAS, by the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, section 138, certain goods may, by Proclamation or Order of Her Majesty in Council, be prohibited either to be exported or carried coastwise: And whereas, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, deem it expedient and necessary to prohibit the goods hereinafter mentioned either to be exported or carried coastwise:

We, by and with the advice aforesaid, do hereby order and direct that from and after the date hereof, torpedoes, torpedoe boats, boats fitted with apparatus to be used for torpedoes, all apparatus for projecting inflammable materials or firing

torpedoes, and the following articles, being articles which We have judged capable of being converted into, or made useful in increasing the quantity of, military or naval stores, that is to say, pumps or other machinery intended to be used for projecting inflammable materials, machinery intended to be used in the construction of torpedoes or torpedoe boats, shall be, and the same are hereby, prohibited either to be exported from the United Kingdom or carried coastwise.

Given at Our Court at *Osborne House, Isle of Wight*, this eighteenth day of *April*, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and in the forty-first year of Our Reign.
