

respectively known as Schleswig and as Holstein, (in this Order referred to as Schleswig-Holstein cattle,) are hereby excepted from the provisions described in the First Schedule to this Order, as far as such exception is necessary for the operation of this Order.

6. Schleswig-Holstein cattle may be landed in a defined part of one of the following ports, and not elsewhere :

Goole.	Middlesbrough.
Grimsby.	Plymouth.
Hartlepool.	Sunderland.
London.	

7. The landing of Schleswig-Holstein cattle shall be subject to the condition that they are accompanied by a declaration and certificates, such as are indicated in the forms in the Second Schedule to this Order, or to the like effect.

8. If the declaration accompanying any cattle imported under this Order is untrue in any particular, as regards any one of the cattle to which it relates, the master of the vessel shall be deemed guilty of an offence against this Order with respect to all the cattle to which the declaration relates, unless he shews to the satisfaction of the Justices before whom he is charged, that he did not know of the same being so untrue, and that he could not with reasonable diligence have obtained that knowledge.

9. Every animal brought in the same vessel with Schleswig-Holstein cattle shall, if landed in Great Britain, be landed in a defined part of one of the ports named in Article 6, and not elsewhere.

10. All provisions for the time being in force relative to animals in a defined part of a port shall apply to animals being in such a part under this Order.

THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

Provisions not applicable to Schleswig-Holstein Cattle.
