**A** DESPATCH, of which the following is a copy, has been received from the Lieutenant-General Commanding at the Cape of Good Hope:—

From Lieutenant-General Honourable F. A. Thesiger, C.B., to the Right Honourable the Secretary of State for War.

*King William's Town, Cape of Good Hope,*  
 Sir, *May 15, 1878.*

1. AS I had the honour of reporting in my despatch as per margin,\* I had arranged the bulk of the forces at my disposal for operations in the Buffalo Range, where the rebels had been undisturbed since the 5th April.

2. They were daily seen in the plateau west of the Buffalo Poort, their numbers being estimated at 1,000 to 1,500.

At the beginning of April, a path had been cut by the troops from the direction of Mount Kempt to the lower portion of this plateau, and by using this (shown on map as "Molyneux Path") I hoped to prevent them retreating with impunity into the bush, all the other paths by which they could retire being at the same time waylaid.

To ensure success in this, it was absolutely necessary that the day of my intention to attack should be kept secret, and that the waylaying parties should be correctly posted.

I had taken every precaution in my power to ensure the first, and the officers detailed for the second duty had been personally shown the paths to be occupied.

3. At daybreak, on the 8th May, the column† moved as follows:—That under Colonel E. Wood, V.C., C.B., from the head of the Rabula River to the Gozo Heights.

A column under Colonel Degacher, 2nd Battalion 24th Regiment, by Wood's Path, through the bush, half a mile west of Haine's Mill, to the plateau above, preceded by Commandant Allan Maclean's Fingoes.

Commandant Von Linsingen found a path a little to the left of the latter column.

Major Buller's force descended from Mount Kempt, by Molyneux Path, to the lower plateaux, Commandant Schermbrucker advancing with his force from Tsidingi, by Mount Kempt, followed

Major Buller, C.B. These forces advanced as ordered, but the company of 2nd Battalion 24th Regiment, under Captain Surplice, and the Fingoes, under Captain Haynes, instead of waylaying the path called Buller's Path, went off too far to their right.

This mistake afforded an opening by which the enemy, on retiring from the plateau above, could escape, their retreat being covered (as actually happened) by a few determined men.

4. The force under Major Buller successfully occupied the lower plateau; but it is his belief, in which I share, that the enemy knew of our intended attack, for there were no signs of a hurried departure.

The number on the plateau seen by him was but 300, but I believe as many more retreated without his seeing them.

The Kaffirs made no stand, but leaving the plateau, which offered very strong positions for defence, they retreated to the bush below by the path shown as Buller's Path, from which, had it been waylaid, these men would have been cut off. What occurred subsequently, in carrying the position taken up by them, is related in Major Buller's report. I regret to say that our loss was heavy in this attack.

5. The conduct of Major Buller deserves the highest praise. He set an example of intrepidity and calm courage to his men under very trying circumstances; and although the operations of this day were not attended with all the success I expected, he did his best, by personal example, to secure it.

6. I beg to bring to your notice the terms in which Commandant Lonsdale is spoken of in the enclosed reports.

This officer is untiring in his exertions, and has before elicited warm commendation from those under whom he has served.

7. The rebels having been driven from the Buffalo Range Plateau during the 8th May, the western portion of the Buffalo Poort Bush was searched the next day: but few Kaffirs were found. Our only casualty was Captain Austen, 2nd Battalion 24th Regiment, slightly wounded.

8. On the 10th I moved details (as per margin)\* of the forces westward to the Intaba District with the view that from this time two distinct forces should daily harass the enemy occupying the

Intaba Ka Udoda and Perie Bushes. I fixed my headquarters between them at Bailie's Post.

9. By my direction Colonel Wood has commenced an earthwork (Fort Evelyn on map) for a garrison of two companies and two guns on the Gozo Heights, this will effectually prevent the plateaux being again occupied by the rebels. An earthwork has likewise been made to the east of the Intaba Ka Udoda for a garrison of two guns and one company; the presence of artillery there will render (as already proved) the occupation by the rebels of the Zanykive Valley and its Kloof impossible.

10. On the 11th May, parties of rebels, unaware of the return of our forces, had reassembled in this valley and its vicinity, but were dispersed by the guns, Royal Artillery, under Major Harness: Commandant Allan Maclean's Fingoes cleared the valley the same day.

11. On the 12th, the rebels were not to be found in their usual haunts when the forces of the Intaba District proceeded from their various posts at daybreak to seek for them. Commandant Von Linsingen, however, came across them about eleven a.m. in the bush to the east of the Makabalele Ridge. Here he attacked them, and, with the forces as per margin,\* dispersed them with a loss of 33 killed. The Commandant speaks in high terms of the manner the force under his command behaved, and of the assistance he received from Commandant Maclean; 18 of the enemy were killed by that officer's Fingoes; 96 women and children were captured, who said that Tini Macomo was present at the fight.

12. On the same day Colonel Wood reports that Commandant Lonsdale, with his Fingoes Levy, left camp on the Gozo Heights at three a.m., and, descending the mountain to Haines Mill, proceeded to beat up the eastern valley of the Buffalo Poort. Captain Harber, commanding the left company, supported by a company under Lieutenant Duncombe, ascended to the stony precipice to the left (Sandilli's Krantz on map), and came upon 500 Kaffirs. In the engagement that ensued he inflicted on the enemy a loss of 44 killed; 18 women surrendered.

13. The loss of Lonsdale's Fingoes was 1 killed and 5 wounded. I consider this engagement reflects great credit on all concerned.

14. The prisoners taken speak of the rebels being greatly disheartened and straitened for food. I myself cannot but feel that the severe losses they have suffered during the past three weeks must have a great effect in shortening the present war; and I was not surprised at hearing from Mr. Brownlee to-day that Sandilli had sent in to ask what terms would be offered him.

15. The instructions given to the forces under my command are not to cease harassing them day or night; and the officers in command are not likely to lose sight of these orders.

16. From the Transkei I have only received private advices from Colonel Glyn, by which I gather he had, up to the time of his writing, not met with any resistance, or, indeed, any of the enemy.

From Colonel Evelyn Wood, Commanding Forces on the Buffalo Range, to the Deputy-Adjutant General.

SIR,

Camp, Gozo Heights,  
May 8, 1878.

IN pursuance of my instructions, I arrived before daylight this morning on these heights with 4 Companies 90th Light Infantry; the two Royal Artillery guns, and escort of 1 Company 90th Light Infantry, arriving at 6.40 a.m., though with some difficulty, and in each gun there is a broken shaft from the guns turning upside down.

Major Buller's column debouched exactly at break of day; Colonel Degacher's column was a little late, the Fingoes being very stiff and cold from the heavy rain last night.

Commandant Schermbrucker arrived about nine a.m., and Von Linsingen about noon. The bush towards Frost's Plateau was beaten according to my orders by Fingoes, and 2 Companies 90th Light Infantry, but there were few Kaffirs north of Frost's Plateau. Some three hundred passed down the Buller-Haine's Mill Bush Path before Maclean's Fingoes reached the mouth of the path.

To ascertain in which direction the Kaffirs had gone, Major Buller led a reconnaissance to the path after Maclean's Fingoes had passed it, and turned northwards.

The Kaffirs held the rocks, as they did on the 29th March, when I reconnoitred in the same direction, and I deeply regret to have to report Captain McNaghten, Adjutant and second in command, Frontier Light Horse, was killed while placing his men in position. This officer served for some time under my orders during the last operations, and gave continued attention to his duties. At the same time also, Captain Whalley, of the Frontier Light Horse, was wounded, Corporal McCabe was killed, and also Private

Klassen, of the Wodehouse Contingent, and two more volunteers were wounded.

As I considered the Kaffirs should be driven out, I called up Maclean's and Lonsdale's Fingoes from Frost's Plateau, and sent the former to turn the Kaffirs' natural fastness by the western, while Lonsdale's men should turn it by the eastern side.

Before, however, Maclean's Fingoes could arrive, they having the widest movement, Commandant Lonsdale pushed down with Captain Bode's Company of Lonsdale's Fingoes and pressed the Kaffirs in flank, when Major Buller, who had declined my offer of fresh troops, led on his men, and, together with seventeen men of the Stutterheim Police, and a few of the 24th Regiment, drove the path with a cheer, and the Kaffirs fell back, with the exception of five men who, armed with double-barrelled guns (taken), killed Private Davies, Frontier Light Horse, and one of Lonsdale's Fingoes, and wounded another before they were slain.

This attack on an immensely strong position was carried out in a most spirited manner by Commandant Lonsdale and by the Frontier Light Horse, the latter having moreover been under fire for a considerable time. During this time the Royal Artillery gun shelled the Buffalo Poort, where fires were burning, and the supposed position of Sandilli's cave. I only know of eight bodies of Kaffirs having been counted, though Mr. Lonsdale saw several fall over the precipice under the fire of those who attacked the Kaffir position. One body was found recently buried.

A Kaffir boy taken by Streatfield's Fingoes, says that all the Kaffir's supplies of spirits, oilman's stores, &c., came from Ross' Mission Station.

*Camp, Mount Kempt,  
May 8, 1878.*

SIR,

I HAVE the honour to report that in accordance with orders I left my camp in the Gwenque Valley with 110 men of the Frontier Light Horse on the 7th, arriving at Isidingi, I found two companies of the 2nd Battalion 24th Regiment, encamped there with two guns, Royal Artillery, instead of on the hill top.

I ordered Major Dunbar to move his two companies at once to this camp, taking only waterproof sheets and blankets. The two guns I left at Isidingi. We reached this camp at 5.30 P.M. Commandant Streatfield arrived with his Fingoes at 11.30 P.M., having made a long march in the dark, and in heavy rain, most cheerfully and expeditiously.

At 4.30 A.M. the 8th, I started with the force detailed in the margin,\* passed through Molyneux Path unopposed, and debouched on the lower plateau at 6.30.

We found the lower plateau unoccupied, but saw a good many Kaffirs crossing the upper one.

I sent the Fingoes into the Buffalo Poort Bush, placed the 24th in advantageous positions lining the edge of it, and started at once with the Frontier Light Horse in pursuit.

Commandant Schermbrucker who had followed me down Molyneux Path here placed at my dis-

posal detachments of Mounted Volunteers of the Corps named in the margin.\*

Ascending the upper plateau we captured eight head of cattle, and drove one party of Kaffirs down a path so steep that we could not follow them.

I asked Commandant Maclean, who had just gained the plateau by Wood's Path, to go in pursuit with his Fingoes, and proceeded myself after some Kaffirs whom I had seen making for Buller's Path.

Passing Colonel Wood, V.C., C.B., who had just gained the upper plateau, by some unfortunate misunderstanding the Frontier Light Horse and all Commandant Schermbrucker's men remained with him and off saddled, so that although I did not know it, I went on with my personal escort alone (Lieutenant Haines and four men).

On nearing the rocky entrance of the path we were suddenly fired upon, two or three volleys in rapid succession, which killed one man and dangerously wounded another, and I found myself in face of the enemy in force with only three effective rifles. Sending one man for assistance he brought up some of the True Blues and Kaffrarian Rangers who were near; and we made an attempt to storm the path, it would have been successful had the new comers come on, but they were unsteady, and we had to retire with the loss of two more men, both I regret to say from the fire of their comrades behind.

Colonel Wood now sent up Colonel Degacher with two companies of the 24th Regiment, but, owing to some misconception, they formed on the right, where there were no Kaffirs. I then brought up the Frontier Light Horse, and, while forming them for attack, I regret to state that Captain Macnaghten was killed, and Captain Whalley severely wounded.

This unsteadied the men, and a desultory fire was kept up on both sides for about an hour, during which the True Blues and the Kaffrarian Watchmen retired.

Commandant Lonsdale then came up with a few Fingoes, and charged the path with them, and the Frontier Light Horse joining him, the position was carried, with two men, one Fingoe and one trooper, being shot dead in the assault.

The Stutterheim Police, who had come up with the Fingoes, supported the assaulting party most efficiently.

Seven (7) Kaffirs were shot dead in the rocks; and as I myself saw at least three more fall dead over the Krantz on the right, I estimated the enemy's loss at fifteen. We got five double-barrelled guns, two being breech-loaders.

Having regard to the nature of the position, which could only be approached by a very few men at a time, I think that all engaged in the assault deserve credit for the manner in which it was delivered, especially Commandant Lonsdale, who acted with the greatest gallantry.

Just as this was over, hearing a very heavy fire on the lower plateau, I descended and found that Major Dunbar was engaged with the enemy, who was holding the edge of the bush. I passed Streatfield's Fingoes in front of him, and cleared the plateau. Three (3) Kaffirs were killed.

We returned to camp above five P.M.

I have ordered the two guns, Royal Artillery, to move here to-morrow from Isidingi, and Major Dunbar to establish his camp here.

9th May. 9.5.—I had no opportunity of sending this till this evening. I have to-day, in accordance with Colonel Wood's orders, scoured the head of the Buffalo Poort Bush, and found it free from Kaffirs. Captain Austen, 2nd Battalion, 24th Regiment, was slightly wounded.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, information to the effect that a recent Royal Spanish Decree requires all vessels, of whatever class or nationality, which touch at intermediate ports between their port of departure and any port of Spain (including the Balearic Islands), to obtain for their Bill of Health the visa of the Spanish Consul resident at the last intermediate port, or, if there is no Spanish Consul there, the visa of the Consul of a friendly nation. Neglect to comply with this regulation renders the Captain of a vessel liable to fine, and the vessel liable to quarantine on arriving in Spain (including the Balearic Islands).
