The Court to change the Mourning on Friday, the 12th of July next; viz.:-

The Ladies to wear black Dresses, with coloured Ribbons, Flowers, Feathers, and Ornaments, or grey or white Dresses, with black Ribbons, Flowers, Feathers, and Ornaments.

The Gentlemen to continue the same Mourning.

And on Friday, the 19th of July next, the Court to go out of Mourning.
