the Algierines would not hearken to any Treaty, unlefs they redeemed their Captives, of which there are above 800 now at Argiers, whom the French demanded without any Ranfom. And when they found they could not obtain that, they proposed a Truce, which the Algierines, likewite rejected.

Paris, June 15. The Express which lately arrived here from the Marquis de Lavardin, was fent back the last week with Orders, as we are told, That he should not make use of the Passport of the Governor of Milan, but that he should pais by Sea from Leghorne to Provence. The Pope's Nuncio here has fent a Courier to Rome, after whole Return, it's believed, his ftay will not be long in this place. We have advice, That the Garifon of Cafal had made an incursion towards Alexandria; from whence, they returned with a good Booty. But a Party of the Mareschal d' Humiere's Army in Flanders has not fucceeded fo well; for having feized a great number of Cattel, they were in their return fallen upon, and defeated, by a detachment of the Garifon of Namur ; and on our fide, a Lieutenant-Collonel, with feveral other Officers, were killed in this Action. The Confederate Troops are before Keyferwaert. The last Letters from the Army, commanded by the Duke de Naailles in Catalonia, advife, That they were marching towards Caftello a Empurias, with defign to poffefs themfelves of that Poft, in order to the Siege of Roles.

Edinburgh, June 1. This Morning early there came out of the Cattle four Deferters, viz. a Sergeant and 3 Soldiers with their Arms, being the Sentinels of the outer Gates, as likewife a Woman, who being examined before the Council, gave the following account. That the Bombs have wholly demolified the Houfe in the Caftle, and that the Duke of Gourdon himfelf was lodged in a Cellar. That he had a Correspondence with some perfors living on the Caffle Hill, who gave him notice when there was any good News, by hanging out a white Cloth, and when bad, a black one; and fometimes by writing on a Board in great Characters, that the Duke might read them with a Telescope. That they had in the Caffle good ftore of Meal, but that their Beef and Cheefe would not lait a Month longer. That their Ammunition was almost spent, and that the Dake of Gourdan began now to delpair of Relief. The Lord Lovas was this day, by Order of the Council, committed to the Tolboot. The Earl of Dunmore, and the Lord Tarbar, are likes wile fecured. The King's Forces are marching to joyn Major-General Muchay. The Perfors above-mentioned, who had Intelligence with the Duke of Gourdon, are leized, and will be exa-
