

the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be fully and freely exercised by the said James Russell or other the Bishop for the time being of the said diocese of Ely and by his successors Bishops of the same diocese for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Matthew Littleport being:—

"All those several contiguous portions of the parish of Littleport of the parish or parochial chapelry of the Holy Trinity Ely of the parish or parochial chapelry of Saint Mary Ely and of the parish of Downham all in the county of Cambridge and in the diocese of Ely which said portion of such cures are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the county boundary which divides the parish of Southey in the county of Norfolk and in the diocese of Norwich from the parish of Littleport aforesaid at the point where such boundary crosses the drain or watercourse called or known as Willow Rows Drain and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said drain or watercourse for a distance of one mile and sixty-eight chains or thereabouts to the centre of Balmorife Bridge which carries the road called or known as the Willow Row Drove over the said drain or watercourse and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of thirty-seven chains or thereabouts to its junction at Spade and Becket Corner with the road called or known as Hale Drove and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of sixteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway connecting the said Hale's Drove with a private road called Crabb's Drove and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the said connecting roadway for a distance of sixteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called or known as Crabb's Drove aforesaid and which leads to the house called or known as Hewit's Hill and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said Crabb's Drove for a distance of sixteen chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the same drove over the drain or watercourse called or known as the Old Croft River and extending thence first south-westward then southward and then south-eastward along the middle of the last-named drain or watercourse for a distance of fifty chains or thereabouts to its junction with the drain or watercourse called or known as Dulcimer Drain and extending thence first southward then westward and then again southward along the middle of the last-named drain or watercourse for a distance of one mile and seventeen chains or thereabouts to the point on the southern side of the bridge called or known as Dulcimer Bridge which carries the road called or known as Black Bank Drove over

the same drain or watercourse where such drain or watercourse joins the drain or watercourse called or known as Grunty Fen Drain and extending thence first westward and then south-westward along the middle of the last-named drain or watercourse for a distance of fifty-four chains or thereabouts thereby passing along the side of the road called or known as Black Bank Drove aforesaid and following in one part the boundary which divides the said parish of Littleport from a certain detached portion of the parish or parochial chapelry of Saint Mary Ely aforesaid and in another part the boundary dividing the said detached portion of the last-named parish or parochial chapelry from a certain detached portion of the parish or parochial chapelry of the Holy Trinity Ely aforesaid to the point where the last-mentioned boundary joins the boundary dividing the said detached portion of the parish or parochial chapelry of Saint Mary Ely from the parish of Downham aforesaid, and extending thence first northward then westward then north-eastward and then north-westward along the north-eastern boundary of the parish of Downham aforesaid for a distance of three miles or thereabouts (which boundary divides the said parish of Downham from certain detached portions of the said parishes or parochial chapelries of Saint Mary Ely and of the Holy Trinity Ely and from the parish of Littleport aforesaid) to the point where the said north-eastern boundary of the parish of Downham bends again to the north-east and continuing thence still north-westward from the last-mentioned boundary to and along the drain or watercourse which divides the close numbered 40 the roadway numbered 39 and the homestead numbered 34 upon the tithe commutation map of the said parish of Downham and upon the map hereunto annexed from the closes numbered respectively 27 28 29 30 and 33 upon the same maps for a distance of forty-four chains or thereabouts to the north-western end of the same drain or watercourse at the foot of the Hundred Feet Bank and continuing thence still north-westward and in a direct line for a distance of two and a half chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the New Bedford River otherwise called or known as the Hundred Feet River and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the same river for a distance of one mile and two chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the north-western end of the road called or known as Bates Drove upon the boundary dividing the said parish of Downham from the parish of Welney situate partly in the said county of Cambridge and partly in the said county of Norfolk and wholly in the diocese of Norwich aforesaid and extending thence south-eastward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to the point on the eastern side of the Hundred Feet Bank aforesaid where the said last-mentioned boundary joins the boundary dividing the said parish of Welney from the parish of Littleport aforesaid and extending thence that is from the last-described point first north-eastward and then eastward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of about one mile and one chain (thereby passing in the first-named direction along the eastern side of the said Hundred Feet Bank) to the point at the Old Croft River aforesaid where the same parish boundary joins the boundary dividing the said county of Cambridge from the county of Norfolk aforesaid and extending thence generally eastward along the said county boundary for a distance of three miles and a quarter or thereabouts (which boundary also divides the said parish of Littleport from the said parish of Welney and from the parish of Hilgay and from the parish
