THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Mobile, reporting the establishment, both at Pensacola and Mobile, of a general quarantine against all vessels arriving at either port from places where yellow fever exists, or may hereafter be found to prevail. Such quarantine to remain in force until the authorities of both ports abolish the same as no longer necessary.
