The Queen has been pleased to grant unto Robert Hull, of Agecroft Hall, in the parish of Eccles, in the County Palatine of Lancuster, Esquire, late Lieutenant in Her Majesty's 5th Fusilier Regiment, eldest surviving son of Robert Pennyman Hull-Brown (formerly Robert Pennyman Hull), of Ambleside, in the county of Westmorland, Clerk, Master of Arts, deceased, Her Royal licence and authority that he and his issue may, in compliance with a clause contained in the last will and testament of his paternal great aunt, Elizabeth Hull, Spinster, deceased, take and henceforth use the surname of Dauntesey in lieu and instead of that of Hull, and that he and they may bear the arms of Dauntesey; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:
