Edward Wilmot Blyden, Esq., Minister Plenipotentiary from the Republic of Liberia, to deliver new Credentials;

To which audience he was introduced by the Marquis of Salisbury, K.G., Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs.

THE Queen, as Sovereign of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, has been graciously pleased by Letters Patent under Her Royal Sign Manual and the Great Seal of the Order, bearing date this day, to dispense with all the Statutes and regulations usually observed in regard to Installation, and to give and grant unto the Most Honourable Robert Arthur Talbot, Marquess of Salisbury, Knight of the said Most Noble Order of the Garter, and duly invested with the Ensigns thereof, full power and authority to exercise all rights and privileges belonging to a Knight Companion of the said Most Noble Order, in as full and ample a manner as if his Lordship had been formally installed, any decree, rule, or usage to the contrary notwithstanding.

The Queen has been graciously pleased to appoint Arthur Wilson, Esq., Barrister-at-Law, to be a Judge of the High Court of Judicature at Fort William, in Bengal, in the room of William Markby, Esq.

The Queen has been pleased to grant unto Henry Calthrop Hollway, of Balliol College, in

the University of Oxford, Esquire, in the Commission of the Peace for the county of Norfolk, and Lieutenant in the 3rd Norfolk Rifle Volunteers, only child of James Hollway, of Stanhoe, in the said county of Norfolk, Esquire, in the Commission of the Peace, and a Deputy Lieutenant for the said county, by Mary Esther, his wife, only child of John Calthrop, late of Stanhoe Hall, in the aforesaid county of Norfolk, Esquire, in the Commission of the Peace, and a Deputy Lieutenant for the same county, both deceased, Her Royal licence and authority that he and his issue may, in compliance with a clause contained in the last will and testament of his maternal grandfather, the said John Calthrop, take and henceforth use the surname of Calthrop, in addition to and after his and their present surname of Hollway, and that he and they may quarter the arms of Calthrop with his and their own family arms; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's College of Arms.
