

Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the part of the Port of Grimsby, in the parts of Lindsey, in the county of Lincoln, within which foreign cattle may be landed for slaughter, as follows:

All that space at the Great Grimsby Royal Dock, in the borough of Grimsby, situate on the north-west side of the lock, known as the 70 feet lock, of the said Royal Dock, bounded by a line commencing at the water of the said lock at a point nineteen feet or thereabouts from the north corner of the said lock, thence running in a straight line in a north-westerly direction for one hundred and six feet or thereabouts along the northern side of certain cattle-pens, slaughter-house, and premises to the north-west corner thereof, thence running in a straight line in a south-westerly direction for two hundred and eighty-one feet or thereabouts along the north-west side of the said cattle-pens, slaughter-house, and premises to the south-west corner thereof, thence running in a straight line in a south-easterly direction for one hundred and six feet or thereabouts along the south-western side of the said cattle-pens, slaughter-house, and premises to the water of the said lock; and thence along the water of the said lock to the point aforesaid; all which space is coloured pink on the plan of part of Great Grimsby Docks, deposited at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Town Clerk of the borough of Grimsby.
