

NOTICE OF INTENDED DISTRIBUTION OF NAVAL PRIZE MONEY.

Department of the Accountant-General of the Navy and Comptroller of Navy Pay, Admiralty, August 6, 1878.

NOTICE is hereby given to the Officers, Seamen, and Marines, and to all persons interested therein, that the distribution of the tonnage bounty awarded for a slave dhow, name unknown, captured on the 12th July, 1877, by Her Majesty's ship "London," will commence on Friday, the 16th instant, in the Prize Branch of the Department of the "Accountant-General of the Navy and Comptroller of Navy Pay, Admiralty, New-street, Spring-gardens, S.W."

Agents and other persons holding powers of attorney, prize orders, assignments, or other instruments, by virtue of which they may be legally entitled to claim the share of any captor serving in the above-named ship, are requested to present the same at this office.

Any Officer, Seaman, Marine, or other person who may desire to receive his share from the Collector of Customs or of Inland Revenue within the United Kingdom, is required to intimate the same by letter to be addressed "On Prize Business, to the Accountant-General of the Navy and Comptroller of Navy Pay, Admiralty, London, S.W." (enclosing his certificate of service or an attested copy thereof, excepting in the case of Commissioned Officers),—in which letter his own place of residence is to be precisely stated, as well as the place of the nearest Collector of Customs, or of Inland Revenue, from whom it would be convenient to receive such share of prize money.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby grant and convey to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Stoke Prior, with the vicarage of Docklow annexed, in the county of Hereford, and in the diocese of Hereford, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same annexed vicarages, all and singular the yearly tithes or rent-charges in lieu of tithes commuted at thirty-five pounds sixteen shillings and one penny farthing, issuing and arising out of lands and hereditaments situate in the parish of Docklow aforesaid, and formerly belonging to the Bishoprick of Hereford, and now vested in us: To have and to hold the said yearly tithes commutation rent-charges, to the use of the said Incumbent and his successors for ever. Provided always, that the Incumbent for the time being of the same annexed vicarages shall be entitled to receive from us, or on our account, the net amount of the profits and proceeds of the said yearly tithes commutation rent-charges for and in respect of the period intervening

between the first day of October, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and the date of the publication of these presents in the London Gazette.
