EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1875 (38 Vic., c. 17).

WHEREAS by Section 68 of the above-named Act, it is provided as follows:—

"The Council of any Borough which is assessed to the county rate of any county by the Justices of such county, and the Commissioners of any Improvement District, may, by order of a Secretary of State made upon the application of such Council or Commissioners, and published in the London Gazette, be declared to be a Local Authority for the purposes of this Act, and thereupon shall become a Local Authority accordingly for such part of their borough or district as is not included in any harbour, to the exclusion of the Justices in Petty Sessions."

(1.) *Rocks near Anamba Islands.*

THE Italian Government has published the following information, relative to the existence of two small rocks, lying about 4 miles N.W. by W. from the north point of Little Telega Island, Anamba Islands.

These rocks (Nicado Rocks) are 5 feet above high water, and were seen by the master of the Italian barque "Nicado."

From the position as given, namely, lat. 3° 9' N., long. 105° 50' E., the east point of Djimaja Island bears S. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., distant 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

(2.) *Sunken Danger in Bashee Channel.*

Information has been received from Vice-Admiral C. F. Hillyar, C.B., Commander-in-Chief on the China Station, relative to the existence of a sunken danger in the Bashee Channel.

This rock (Forest Belle Rock), on which the American barque "Forest Belle" struck, lies S. 10° W., distant 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Little Botel Tobago Island.

Bahia de Cadiz Light is a revolving white light, attaining its greatest brilliancy every minute.

Nuevitas Harbour, Maternillos Light is a fixed and flashing light, showing a white flash every minute.
