THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Lisbon, enclosing copies of notices issued by the Portuguese Government, declaring the ports of New Orleans and Bahia infected with, and all the other ports of Louisiana and of the Province of Bahia, suspected of, yellow fever since the 15th July last. Also, the ports of Montevideo, Buenos Ayres, and Daker infected with the same disease since the 20th May and 24th July last respectively.
