

The Bankruptcy Act, 1861.**Notice of Dividend Meeting.**

A Meeting of the Creditors of the Bankrupt hereinafter named will be held, pursuant to the 174th section of the said Act, at the time and place hereinafter mentioned; that is to say:—

At the County Court of Gloucestershire, holden at Bristol, before the Registrar:

Thomas Sampson and William Barnard (trading as Thomas Barnard and Company), of Ham Mills, Stroud, in the county of Gloucester, Shawl and Woollen Cloth Manufacturers, adjudicated bankrupts on the 9th day of March, 1860.
