THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Tenerite, reporting that the authorities of the Canary Islands have declared the ports of Morocco to be foul since the 17th August, in consequence of the prevalence of cholera in that Empire, and that the Canary Islands will be closed against vessels arriving from Morocco, which will have to proceed to Vigo to perform quarantine.
