

formed, nor to convey to the said incumbent or to the churchwardens of the said parish of Saint David's Llanfaes any claim or right to dispose of the alms collected at the offertory in the church or chapel of the said college unless and until such college church or chapel shall by virtue of the provisions contained in the 10th section of the said Act of the 16th and 17th years of Her present Majesty chapter 82 become and be made the parish church of the said parish of Saint Davids Llanfaes in lieu of the present parish church.

"That the right of patronage or presentation to the said vicarage or parish church of Saint Davids Llanfaes shall remain as heretofore.

"To the Most Reverend Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury.

"I the Venerable Henry de Winton Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry of Brecon in the Cathedral Church of Saint Davids lawfully founded the patron or the person entitled to present to the vicarage of Saint Davids Llanfaes in the county of Brecon and diocese of Saint Davids in case the same were now vacant, and I the Reverend Rees Price Clerk vicar of the said vicarage do hereby respectively signify to your Grace our consent to the scheme hereinbefore proposed for annexing the extra-parochial place or district of Christ's College to the said parish of Saint Davids Llanfaes.

"As witness our respective hands this ninth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

And whereas the said Lord Bishop hath transmitted the said scheme to the said Lord Archbishop together with the said consents.

And whereas the said Lord Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with such scheme hath certified the same and such consents as aforesaid by his report to Her Majesty in Council dated the 15th day of November 1878, which report is in the words and figures following:—

"To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

"We the undersigned Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury do hereby report to your Majesty in Council.

"That the Right Reverend William Basil Lord Bishop of St. Davids has represented unto us (amongst other things):—

"That there is in the county of Brecon and diocese of St. Davids the vicarage of St. Davids Brecon otherwise known as St. Davids Llanfaes Brecon.

"That contiguous to the said parish of St. Davids Llanfaes and situate within the limits of the said parish there is a place or district known by the name of Christ's College the boundaries whereof are well known and defined and which place or district is altogether extra-parochial.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that the whole of the said extra-parochial place or district may with advantage be annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the said contiguous parish of St. Davids Llanfaes.

"That the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him the proposed alteration may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes rent-charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in

respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of the patron and incumbent of the said benefice of St. Davids Llanfaes has been transmitted by the said Lord Bishop to us for our consideration.

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents before referred to are hereunto annexed.

"And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and inquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the Act of the first and second years of your Majesty's reign chapter 106 certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to your Majesty in Council to the intent that your Majesty in Council may in case your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect.

"As witness our hands this fifteenth day of November one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

Now therefore Her Majesty in Council by and with the advice of Her said Council is pleased to order and doth hereby order that the said scheme of the Lord Bishop of Saint Davids be carried into effect.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That whenever it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, with respect to his own diocese, and whenever it shall be represented to him by the Bishop of any diocese, or by the Bishops of any two dioceses, that two or more benefices, or that one or more benefice or benefices, and one or more spiritual sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages, in his or their diocese or dioceses, being either in the same parish or contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population shall not exceed one thousand five hundred persons, and the aggregate yearly value shall not exceed five hundred pounds, may, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one benefice, the said Archbishop of the Province shall inquire into the circumstances of the case; and if on such inquiry it shall appear to him that such union may be usefully made, and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that the patron or patrons of the said benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages respectively, is or are consenting thereto, such consent being signified in writing under the hands of such patron or patrons, the said Archbishop shall, six weeks before certifying such inquiry and consent to Her Majesty, as herein-after directed, cause, with respect to his own diocese, a statement in writing of the facts, and in other cases a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation, to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the church, or in some public and conspicuous place in each of
