PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of the Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty intituled "An Act to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," after reciting that "Whereas, in some instances, tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may in some instances with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when, with respect to his own diocese, it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district within the diocese of such archbishop, or the diocese of such bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said archbishop or bishop shall draw up a scheme, in writing (the scheme of such bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration), describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent, in writing, under

"his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to Her Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect; and such Order being registered in the registry of the diocese, which the registrar is hereby required to do, shall be forthwith binding on all persons whatsoever including the incumbent or incumbents of the benefice or benefices to be affected thereby, if he or they shall have consented thereto in writing under his or their hands."

And whereas the Lord Bishop of Lincoln hath made a representation in writing to his Grace the Archbishop of Canterbury in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"To the Most Reverend Archibald Campbell
Lord Archbishop of Canterbury.

"I the Right Reverend Christopher Lord Bishop of Lincoln do hereby represent to your Grace that there is in the county and diocese of Lincoln the vicarage and parish church of Keddington.

"That the population of the parish of Keddington aforesaid according to the census of one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one amounts to one hundred and forty-four persons.

"That there is one church belonging to the said parish of Keddington affording accommodation for one hundred and eighty-two adults and children.

"That the net annual value of the said vicarage of Keddington is seventy-seven pounds fifteen shillings arising from glebe and a grant from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne.

"That there is no sufficient house of residence for the incumbent of the said benefice.

"That the said vicarage of Keddington is in the patronage of Sir William Earle Welby Gregory of Denton Hall in the said county of Lincoln Baronet M.P.

"That there is in the said county and diocese the perpetual curacy or vicarage of the district chapelry of the Holy Trinity Louth.

"That the population of the said district chapelry of the Holy Trinity Louth according to the census of one thousand eight hundred and

seventy-one amounts to two thousand two hundred persons.

"That there is one church belonging to the said district chapelry affording accommodation for eight hundred persons.

"That the net annual value of the said perpetual curacy or vicarage of the district chapelry of the Holy Trinity Louth aforesaid is one hundred and ninety-nine pounds two shillings arising from endowments by Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England.

"That the said perpetual curacy or vicarage of the district chapelry of the Holy Trinity Louth aforesaid is in my patronage by virtue of my bishoprick.

"That a portion of the said district chapelry of the Holy Trinity Louth containing a population of about six persons is situate at a distance of one mile and six furlongs from the church of the said district chapelry but the same is within one mile of the parish church of Keddington.

"That it appears to me that the said portion of the district chapelry of the Holy Trinity Louth as shown upon the plan hereunto appended and thereon coloured yellow may under the provisions of the Act 1 and 2 Victoria, chapter 106 be advantageously separated from the said district chapelry and annexed and united to the said parish and parish church of Keddington and in the event of such proposed separation annexation and union being carried into effect it is proposed to apply for the union of the said vicarage of Keddington with the rectory of Stewton in the said county and diocese to which rectory it will then be contiguous.

"That pursuant to the direction contained in the twenty-sixth section of the said above-mentioned Act of Parliament I the said Lord Bishop of Lincoln have drawn up a scheme in writing appended to this representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alteration above proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and I do submit the same to your Grace together with the consent in writing of the said Sir William Earle Welby Gregory Baronet M.P. the patron and the Reverend William Smith the vicar of the said vicarage of Keddington and of me the said Christopher Lord Bishop of Lincoln in right of my bishoprick the patron and the Reverend George Sidney Streatfeild the perpetual curate or vicar of the said perpetual curacy or vicarage of the district chapelry of the Holy Trinity Louth aforesaid to the intent that your Grace may if on full consideration and inquiry you shall be satisfied with the scheme certify the same and such consents to Her Majesty in Council."

And whereas the scheme and consents mentioned in the said representation are in the words and figures following:—

"SCHEME.

"That the portion of the district chapelry of the Holy Trinity Louth which is shown on the plan hereto annexed and thereon coloured yellow and more particularly described in the schedule hereto be separated from the said perpetual curacy or vicarage and church of the district chapelry of the Holy Trinity Louth and annexed to the said vicarage and parish church of Keddington for all ecclesiastical purposes and that it shall be and remain under the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said vicarage of Keddington now is.

"That the incumbent of Keddington shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the said portion of the district chapelry of the Holy Trinity Louth so to be annexed to the said parish of Keddington.

"That baptisms churchings marriages and burials in respect of the inhabitants of the said portion of the district chapelry of the Holy Trinity Louth shall be performed and shall take place in the church of Keddington and in the burial ground thereto belonging and that the fees for all such and other ecclesiastical offices and all ecclesiastical dues and offerings arising from or in respect of the said portion of the said district chapelry of the Holy Trinity Louth so to be annexed to the said parish of Keddington and usually payable to the incumbent of a benefice shall belong and be paid to the incumbent of the said parish and benefice of Keddington.

"That the inhabitants of the same portion of the said district chapelry of the Holy Trinity Louth shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the church of the said district chapelry of the Holy Trinity Louth or any other church or chapel now or hereafter to be erected in the said district chapelry but shall be liable subject to the provisions of 'The Compulsory Church Rate Abolition Act, 1868' to repair the said church of Keddington.

"That the inhabitants of the said portion of the district chapelry of the Holy Trinity Louth shall be entitled to resort to and attend the said church of Keddington as their parish church and to be accommodated with sittings therein but shall not henceforth be entitled to any accommodation in the church of the said district chapelry of the Holy Trinity Louth or in any church or chapel now or hereafter to be erected in the said district chapelry.

"That nothing herein contained shall affect the endowments of the said perpetual curacy or vicarage of the district chapelry of the Holy Trinity Louth or the rights of patronage to either of the said benefices of the district chapelry of the Holy Trinity Louth and vicarage of Keddington.

"Given under my hand the third day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

"The SCHEDULE to which the above Representation and Scheme have reference.

"All that part of the district chapelry of the Holy Trinity Louth which is bounded on the north-east and east by the parishes of North Cockerington South Cockerington and 3.50 chains in length of the parish of Stewton on the south by twenty chains in length of that part of the parish of South Cockerington known by the name of 'Stewton Nooking' on the south-west by a straight line commencing in the boundary between the parish of South Cockerington and Louth Park at a point twenty chains west of the north-eastern corner of the said 'Stewton Nooking' and running in a north-westerly direction to a bridge over Monks' Dike where the said Monks' Dike is crossed by an occupation road leading from lands of Mr. Thomas Beverley to the highway from Louth to Saltfleet which occupation road adjoins Louth Abbey Garth on the north-east side of the said Louth Abbey Garth and thence the said boundary turns in a northerly direction for a length of 1.75 chains along the east side of garden the property of William Allison Esquire on the north side of Monks' Dike and thence it turns in a westerly direction for a length of two chains along the north side of the said garden and

thence the said boundary is part of the occupation road before described running in a north-westerly direction past Louth Abbey Garth to the highway leading from Louth to Saltfleet on the north-west by the parish of Keddington.

And whereas the said Lord Bishop of Lincoln hath, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, transmitted such scheme to the said Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, together with the said consents.

And whereas the said Lord Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with such scheme hath certified the same and such consents as aforesaid by his report to Her Majesty in Council dated the twenty-third day of October one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, which report is in the words and figures following :—

“ To the QUEEN’s Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

“ We the undersigned Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, do hereby report to your Majesty in Council that the Right Reverend Christopher Lord Bishop of Lincoln has represented unto us (amongst other things) :

“ That there is in the county and diocese of Lincoln the vicarage and parish church of Keddington.

“ That there is also in the said county and diocese the perpetual curacy or vicarage of the district chapelry of the Holy Trinity Louth.

“ That a portion of the said district chapelry of the Holy Trinity Louth containing a population of about six persons is situate at a distance of one mile and six furlongs from the church of the said district chapelry but the same is within one mile of the parish church of Keddington.

“ That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that the said portion of the said district chapelry may be advantageously separated from the said district chapelry and be annexed and united for ecclesiastical purposes to the parish of Keddington and

that in the event of such proposed separation annexation and union being carried into effect it is proposed to apply for the union of the said vicarage of Keddington with the rectory of Stewton in the same county and diocese to which rectory it will then be contiguous.

“ That the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him the proposed alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of the patrons and incumbents of the said benefices of Keddington and Holy Trinity Louth has been transmitted by the said Lord Bishop to us for our consideration.

“ The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents before referred to are hereunto annexed.

“ And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the Act of the first and second years of your Majesty’s reign chapter 106, certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to the intent that your Majesty in Council may in case your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect.

“ As witness our hand this twenty-third day of October one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

THE TYPHOID FEVER OF SWINE ORDER OF 1878.

AT the *Council Chamber, Whitehall*, the 17th day of *December*, 1878.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order may be cited as The Typhoid Fever of Swine Order of 1878.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-third day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

3. This Order extends to Great Britain only.

4. In this Order—

The Act of 1878 means The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1878.

5. Typhoid fever of swine (otherwise called soldier disease or red disease) shall be deemed to be a disease for the purposes of the following sections of the Act of 1878 (namely):

Section thirty (slaughter and compensation).

Section thirty-one (notice of disease).

Section thirty-two (Orders of Council).

Section fifty (powers of police).

Section fifty-one (power of entry).

And of all other sections of the Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections, including such sections as provide for offences and procedure.

6. The provisions of the undermentioned Articles of the following Orders shall, so far as they may be applicable, apply to typhoid fever of swine and to places where that disease is found to exist (namely):

(a.) The Animals Order of 1878—

Articles eighteen and nineteen (movement or exposure of animals).

Article twenty (movement of dung).

Articles twenty-one and twenty-two (cases).

Articles twenty-three, twenty-four, twenty-five, twenty-seven, twenty-nine, thirty-two and thirty-three (general provisions).

(b.) The Cleansing and Disinfection Order of 1878—

Articles ten, eleven, twelve, thirteen and fourteen (cleansing and disinfection).

7. A Local Authority shall cause all swine affected with typhoid fever to be slaughtered, and shall, out of the local rate, pay to the owner thereof, by way of compensation for every head of swine so slaughtered, one half of its value immediately before it became so affected, but so that the compensation do not in any case exceed forty shillings.

8. No swine shall be moved out of a pig-sty, shed, or place where typhoid fever exists, or has within six days existed, except for the purpose of being slaughtered, and with a licence of the Local Authority. That licence shall be available for twelve hours and no longer, and shall specify the place to which the swine are to be moved for slaughter. The swine shall be moved to that place under the direction and in charge of an Inspector or other officer of the Local Authority, who shall enforce and superintend the immediate slaughter there of the swine, and shall report the fact of the slaughter to the Local Authority.

9. Where a head of swine is seized in accordance with the provisions of Article 19 of The Animals Order of 1878 the same shall be slaughtered in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, (in this Order referred to as the Act of 1878,) and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of December, one

thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight; and words in this Order have the same meaning as in the Act of 1878.

2. Cattle brought from a port or place in Belgium or the German Empire, and cattle, sheep, or goats being or having been on board a vessel at the same time with cattle so brought, shall not be landed in Great Britain.

3. This Order shall have effect in substitution for the Order of Council dated the twenty-seventh day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, relating to importation from Belgium and the German Empire, and that Order is hereby revoked as from the commencement of this Order: Provided that nothing herein shall invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Order before this Order takes effect, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the said Order.

(COUNTY OF EDINBURGH.)

THE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other

power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. In this Order words have the same meaning as in The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878.

2. Cattle affected with pleuro-pneumonia may be moved out of places infected with pleuro-pneumonia, within the parishes of St. Cuthberts, Cramond, Corstorphine, Colinton, Liberton, Duddingstone, North Leith, and South Leith, situate in the county of Edinburgh, for slaughter, in manner and under the conditions following, and not otherwise:

(1.) The diseased cattle shall be moved with a licence of the Local Authority of the County of Edinburgh, to a public slaughter-house situate in the Burgh of Edinburgh or in the Burgh of Leith specified in the licence, in a float or cattle-van properly constructed so as to prevent contact of the diseased cattle with other cattle during the movement.

(2.) The diseased cattle shall be moved to the slaughter-house in charge of an Inspector or other officer of the Local Authority of the County of Edinburgh; and the same officer shall enforce and superintend the immediate slaughter there of the cattle, and shall forthwith report the fact of the slaughter to that Local Authority.

(3.) The float or cattle-van shall immediately after each occasion of use be cleansed and disinfected, by or under the superintendence of the same officer, in manner provided respecting vans by Article 8 of The Cleansing and Disinfection Order of 1878.

THE TRANSIT OF ANIMALS ORDER.

At the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 19th day of December, 1878.

The Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

2. This Order may be cited as The Transit of Animals Order.

3. This Order extends to Great Britain only.

4. In this Order—

The Act of 1878 means The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878:

Master includes a person having the charge or command of a vessel:

Truck means a vehicle used or intended for carrying animals on a railway:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1878.

Transit by Sea.

5. With respect to places used for animals on board vessels, the following regulations shall have effect:

(1.) Every such place shall be divided into pens by substantial divisions.

(2.) Each pen shall not exceed nine feet in breadth, or fifteen feet in length.

(3.) The floor of each pen shall have proper battens or other foot-holds thereon.

(4.) Every such place, if inclosed, shall be ventilated by means of separate inlet and outlet openings, of such size and position as will secure a proper supply of air to the place in all states of weather.

6. Between each first day of November and the next following thirtieth day of April (both days inclusive) freshly shorn sheep shall not be carried on the deck of a vessel.

7. Where sheep are carried on the deck of a vessel, proper gangways shall be provided either between or above the pens in which they are carried.

8. Animals landed from a vessel shall, on a certificate of an Inspector of the Privy Council, certifying to the effect that the foregoing regulations, or some or one of them, have not or has not been observed in the vessel, be detained, at the place of landing, or in lairs adjacent thereto, until the Privy Council otherwise direct.

Shipping and Unshipping Places.

9. At every place where animals are put on board of or landed from vessels, provision shall be made to the satisfaction of the Privy Council, for a supply of water for animals; and water shall be supplied there, gratuitously, on request of any person having charge of any animal.

10. At every place where animals are landed from vessels, provision shall be made, to the satisfaction of the Privy Council, for the speedy and convenient unshipment of animals, and for a supply of food for them; and food shall be supplied there, on request of any person having charge of any animal, at such price as the Privy Council, from time to time, approve.

Transit by Railway.

11. Every truck shall be provided with spring buffers, and the floor thereof shall have proper battens or other foot-holds thereon.

12. A railway company shall not allow any truck to be overcrowded so as to cause unnecessary suffering to the animals therein.

13. Between each first day of November and the next following thirtieth day of April (both days inclusive) trucks used for carrying sheep freshly shorn and unclothed shall be covered and inclosed so as to protect the sheep from the weather, but shall be properly ventilated.

Offences.

14. If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of any of the foregoing provisions of this Order, the owner and the master of the vessel in which,—and the owner and the occupier of the place where animals are put on board of or landed from vessels at which,—and the railway company carrying animals on or owning or working the railway on which,—and also, in case of the overcrowding of a truck on a railway, or of the carrying on a railway of sheep freshly shorn and unclothed, the consignor of the animals in respect of which,—(as the case may be,) the same is done or omitted, shall each be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878:

But no person shall be liable to a penalty under this Order in respect of sheep as freshly shorn, where it is proved that the sheep have not been shorn within sixty days before the time of the commission of the alleged offence.

Water Supply on Railways.

15. The railway companies working the railways named in the Schedule to this Order shall make a provision of water, to the satisfaction of the Privy Council, at each of the stations therein named, for animals carried or about to be or having been carried on those railways.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, as follows :

1. This Order may be cited as The Revocation (No. 2) Order of 1878.

2. This Order shall take effect from and

immediately after the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

3. The Orders of Council described in Part I of the Schedule to this Order as far as the same are in force are hereby revoked ; but this revocation shall not—

- (a.) revive any Order or part of any Order revoked by or otherwise affect the past operation of any of those Orders ;
- (b.) affect the validity or invalidity of anything done or suffered, or any appointment made, or any licence or authority granted, or any right, title, obligation, or liability accrued thereunder, before this Order takes effect ;
- (c.) interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against or any penalty or forfeiture incurred under any Order hereby revoked.

4. The Orders described in Part II of the Schedule to this Order are the only Orders made before this Order that will remain in force after the commencement of this Order.
