THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Loanda, enclosing a copy of a Decree issued by the Loanda Health Department imposing quarantine on all arrivals from the United States ports of the Gulf of Mexico and from Goree, which are declared to be infected with yellow fever since the 15th and 24th July last, respectively, and from Portuguese Guinea and Sierra Leone which are stated to be suspected of the same disease since the 24th July last.
