

"And with the like consent of the said William Basil Bishop of the said diocese of St. David's (testified as aforesaid) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published and that marriages baptisms churchings and burials should be solemnized or performed both at the said church of the Holy Trinity situate at Felinfoel as aforesaid and also at the said church of Saint Michael and All Angels situate at Dafen as aforesaid and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices in each of the two churches aforesaid should be paid and belong to the ministers thereof for the time being respectively: Provided always that so long as the Reverend David Williams Canon of the Cathedral Church of Saint Davids the present vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the said parish of Llanelly shall continue to be such vicar or incumbent all the fees which may be received at each of the two churches aforesaid shall be paid over by the respective ministers of the same churches to the said David Williams and provided also that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty in your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The FIRST SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of the Holy Trinity Felinfoel being:—

"All that part of the parish of Llanelly in the county of Carmarthen and in the diocese of Saint Davids wherein the present incumbent of such parish now possesses the exclusive cure of souls which is bounded on the east partly by the parish or parochial chapelry of Llangennech and partly by the parish or parochial chapelry of Llannon both in the county and diocese aforesaid on the north-east by the last-named parish or parochial chapelry on the north-west partly by the parish of Llanddarog and partly by the parish or parochial chapelry of Llangydeyrn both in the said county and diocese on the west by the last-named parish or parochial chapelry on the south-west by the parish of Pembrey in the said county and diocese and upon the remaining sides that is to say on the south and on the south-east by an imaginary line commencing at the point at or near to the houses called or known as Cwm-bach where the boundary which divides the said parish of Pembrey from the parish of Llanelly aforesaid crosses the middle of the turnpike-road leading from Kidwelly to Llanelly and called or known as the Old Kidwelly-road and extending thence first south-eastward and then eastward along the middle of the said turnpike-road for a distance of one mile or thereabouts to the point at or near to the houses called or known as Furnace where the same turnpike-road is crossed by the line of the Old Carmarthenshire Tramway and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said tramway for a distance of half a mile or thereabouts to the point where it crosses Dimpeth-lane and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to its point of junction with the turnpike-road leading from Llanelly to Llannon and

extending thence south-eastward and in a direct line for a distance of fifty-five chains or thereabouts, thereby crossing the River Lledi to the point where Capel-road is joined by the road leading past the houses called or known as Bryngwyn-bach to Dafen and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said Capel-road for a distance of twenty-seven chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road or lane leading past the groups of houses called or known respectively as Bryngwyn Mawr and Cilsaig and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-described road or lane for a distance of fifty-seven chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the Dafen River and extending thence first north-westward and then north-eastward along the middle of the last-named river for a distance of one mile and a quarter or thereabouts to the boundary at the point where the same river is crossed by the road leading from the turnpike-road from Llanelly to Llannon aforesaid past the Graiglwyd Mission-room to Llangennech which boundary divides the said parish of Llanelly from the parish of Llangennech aforesaid.

"The SECOND SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Michael and All Angels Dafen being:—

"All that part of the said parish of Llanelly which is by bounded on the north-east by the parish or parochial chapelry of Llangennech aforesaid on the east and on the south-east by the parish of Loughor in the county of Glamorgan and in the diocese of Saint Davids aforesaid or in other words by the estuary of the River Loughor on the south by the southern boundary of the parish of Llanelly or in other words by the estuary of the River Loughor aforesaid on the south-west by the new parish of Saint Paul Llanelly within the original limits of the said parish of Llanelly and upon the remaining side that is to say on the north-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary dividing the said new parish of Saint Paul Llanelly from the parish of Llanelly aforesaid at a point near to the house called or known as Marble Hall in the middle of the road leading from Trostre to Llanelly such point being directly over the Marble Hall Tunnel and near to the junction of the last-described road with Marble Hall-lane and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of twenty-seven chains or thereabouts to its junction with the turnpike-road leading from Llanelly to Swansea and called or known as Swansea-road and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-mentioned turnpike-road for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts to its junction at Capel Issaf with Capel-road and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of twenty-seven chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road or lane leading past the groups of houses called or known respectively as Bryngwyn Mawr and Cilsaig and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-described road or lane for a distance of fifty-seven chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the Dafen River and extending thence first north-westward and then north-eastward along the middle of the last-named river for a distance of one mile and a quarter or thereabouts to the boundary at the point where the same river is crossed by the road leading from the turnpike-road from Llanelly to Llannon aforesaid past the Graiglwyd Mission Room to Llangennech which boundary divides the said parish of Llanelly from
