"We, therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint George Millom being:—

"All that part of the parish of Millom in the county of Cumberland and in the diocese of Carlisle wherein the present incumbent of such parish now possesses the exclusive cure of souls which is bounded on the south and on the east by the boundary, in the estuary of the River Duddon, which divides the county of Lancaster from the county of Cumberland aforesaid and upon all other sides that is to say on the north and on the west by an imaginary line commencing upon the said county boundary at a point called or known as Low Ford on the Duddon Sands where the road leading at low water from Ireleth across the said Duddon Sands to Holborn Hill crosses the estuary

the said parish or parochial chapelry of Stroud all that piece or parcel of land which is called or known as the Stroud Cemetery and which contains by admeasurement nine acres and twenty-two perches or thereabouts."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the respective Registrars of the said diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, in the registries at Gloucester and at Bristol respectively.

your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, the sum of three hundred and thirty-three pounds six shillings and eight pence New Three Pounds per centum Bank Annuities being part of the endowment held in trust for the rector or incumbent of the said rectory of Newchurch and his successors by the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne for the augmentation of the maintenance of the poor clergy shall henceforth cease to be so held in trust for the same rector and his successors and shall be held by the said Governors in trust for and for the benefit of the incumbent of the said consolidated chapelry of All Saints Glazebury, and his successors, incumbents of the same consolidated chapelry and shall form part of the endowments thereof.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England acting under the provisions of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of your Majesty chapter ninety-four have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Prion in the county of Denbigh and in the diocese of Saint Asaph.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of your Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-third day of January in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty and published in the London Gazette upon the twenty-fifth day of the same month the district of Prion was constituted out of the parish of Llanrhaidr in Kinmerch in the county and diocese aforesaid.

"And whereas the said district of Prion has become a new parish of the character contemplated by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty chapter thirty-seven and by the said above-

mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of your Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

“And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Prion should be altered by way of extension so that they shall include certain additional portions of the said parish of Llanrhaidr in Kinmerch.

“Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Joshua Bishop of the said diocese of Saint Asaph (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation the boundaries of the said new parish of Prion shall be altered by way of extension so that they shall include all those portions of the said parish of Llanrhaidr in Kinmerch which are described in the schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto appended and are thereon coloured pink and that from and after the day of the same date and without any other assurance in law the said portions of the parish of Llanrhaidr in Kinmerch so to be included as aforesaid shall become and be and form part of the said new parish of Prion.

“And we further represent recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

“The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

“The territory proposed to be annexed to the new parish of Prion in the county of Denbigh and in the diocese of Saint Asaph being:—

I. All that portion of the parish of Llanrhaidr in Kinmerch in the county and diocese aforesaid wherein the present incumbent of such parish now possesses the exclusive cure of souls which is bounded on the south by the new parish of Prion aforesaid on the west by that portion of the said parish of Llanrhaidr in Kinmerch which, under the provisions of an Order of Her Majesty in Council bearing date the eighteenth day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight and published in the London Gazette on the seventh day of May following, has been annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the parish of Nantglyn in the county and diocese aforesaid on the north by that portion of the said parish of Llanrhaidr in Kinmerch which under the provisions of the said Order in Council has been annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the parish of Denbigh in the same county and diocese and upon the remaining side that is to say on the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Denbigh (as extended by the above-mentioned Order in Council) from the parish of Llanrhaidr in Kinmerch aforesaid (as limited by the same Order in Council) at the point where the stream called or known as Aberbechan crosses the road leading from Denbigh past the houses called or known respectively as Bryn Daint, Caeau Gwynion, Bryn-y-gwynt, and Maes-y-plum, to Prion Church, and extending thence first southward and then south-westward along the middle of the said road for a distance of sixty-eight chains or thereabouts to the boundary

All that portion of the said parish of Llanrhaidr in Kinmerch wherein the present incumbent of such parish now possesses the exclusive cure of souls which is bounded on the south and on the west by the new parish of Prion aforesaid and upon all other sides that is to say, on the north-west on the north-east and on the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Prion from the parish of Llanrhaidr in Kinmerch aforesaid at the point at the houses called or known as Tai-bryn-mulan aforesaid where the said road leading from the house called or known as Segrwyd-uchaf past the house called or known as Rosa-bach to the houses called or known as Tai-bryn-mulan as aforesaid joins the road leading from Prion Church past the last-named houses to Denbigh and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of twenty-three chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading past the houses called or known respectively as Berllan-bach and Graig-llwyd to Llanrhaidr and extending thence first southward then eastward and then south-eastward along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of one mile or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading from the said house called or known as Graig-llwyd to the house called or known as Groes-ford and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of thirty chains or thereabouts to the boundary at the point at or near to the last-named house where the said last-described road joins the road leading from the house called or known as Buarth Mawr to the house called or known as Pen-y-Waen which boundary divides the said parish of Llanrhaidr in Kinmerch from the new parish of Prion aforesaid.

All that portion of the said parish of Llanrhaidr in Kinmerch wherein the present incumbent of such parish now possesses the exclusive cure of souls which comprises and includes the houses called or known respectively as Bocced, Bryn-Occin, Pen-y-clip and Tai-isaf and which said portion of such parish is bounded on the north and on the north-west by the new parish of Prion aforesaid and upon all other sides that is to say on the south and on the south-east by that portion of the said parish of Llanrhaidr in Kinmerch which under the provisions of the Order in Council above-mentioned has been annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the parish of Gyffylliog in the county and diocese aforesaid.”

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the patron and to the incumbents of the two cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation, and such patron and incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been

of Robert Reddish, of Rock Mount, near Blackburn, in the said county of Lancaster, Esquire, and of Thomas Worsley, of Gaulkthorn, Oswaldtwistle, Esquire, as the patrons of the perpetual curacy of the said particular district of Oswaldtwistle (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said particular district of Oswaldtwistle and of the said new parish of Saint Thomas Blackburn which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Oswald situate at Knuzen as aforesaid, and that the same should be named ‘The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Oswald, Knuzen.’

county of York and in the diocese of Ripon being :—

“All that part of the parochial chapelry of Elland in the parish of Halifax in the county and diocese aforesaid wherein the present incumbent of such parochial chapelry now possesses the exclusive cure of souls which is comprised within and is co-extensive with the limits of that portion of the district of the ‘Greenland Local Board’ which is situate on the south-eastern side of the new parish of Saint Thomas Greenland aforesaid as the said Local Board District is described in the Provisional Order of Her Majesty’s Secretary of State for the Home Department bearing date the fourteenth day of November in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four and as the same district was subsequently limited and described in the further Order of the same Secretary of State for the Home Department confirming his previous Order, which said second Order bears date the eleventh day of March in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five and was published in the London Gazette on the fourteenth day of the said month of March.”

time as occasion may arise in the purchase of other lands tithes rent-charges tenements or hereditaments, or of some estate or interest therein convenient to be assigned as the endowment for the said Dean and Chapter or to be held by us for the purposes of the Acts by which our proceedings are governed as aforesaid and in the meantime to invest the said proceeds in some Government or Parliamentary stock or other public securities in England.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Lichfield.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order may be cited as The Dairies, Cow-Sheds, and Milk-Shops Amendment Order of 1879.
2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the making thereof.
3. This Order extends to Great Britain only.

4. A person who carries on the trade of cow-keeper or dairyman for the purpose only of making and selling butter or cheese or both, and who does not carry on the trade of purveyor of milk, shall not be deemed to be a person carrying on the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman within Article 5 of The Dairies, Cow Sheds, and Milk-Shops Order of 1879.

HER Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received from Señor J. M. Torres Caicedo, Minister Plenipotentiary at the Court of St. James for the Republic of Salvador, a communication, of which the following is a translation, relative to the proceedings of certain vessels, not belonging to Salvador, which, according to information received by his Government, sail under the flag of that State, with ships' papers purporting to have been issued by agents of the Salvadorean Government.

(Translation.)

Legation of the Republic of Salvador,
MY LORD, *Paris, February 3, 1879.*

I DO myself the honour of addressing your Excellency, for the purpose of stating that my Government has directed me to inform your Excellency that there are some vessels, especially merchant vessels, which sail under the flag of Salvador, and with ships' papers purporting to have been issued by agents of that Republic; that those vessels do not belong to Salvador, for that State has no navy; that to prevent abuses in future, and to avert responsibilities which might be made to rest upon the Salvadorean Government, that Government represents these facts, in order that your Excellency may be pleased to take note of the following declaration: that henceforth any vessel which says it belongs to the Salvadorean navy must produce the commission issued by the Government of that nation, and countersigned by the Minister of State of the relative department.

In making this declaration, the object of my Government is to prevent ulterior reclamations, for some have already been presented. If any vessel should present itself under the Salvadorean flag, without the aforesaid requisite, that flag could not, in any case, cover the ship, the merchandise, or the crew.

I venture to hope that your Excellency will be pleased to make such use of this letter as may be considered expedient for the production of its effects.

I hasten at once to express to your Excellency, in the name of my Government, the most sincere thanks for your friendly intervention in this matter, and for the purposes indicated.

May your Excellency be pleased to accept the assurances, &c.

Arrivals from Greece, Egypt, and Tunis are to be kept in quarantine until further orders.

Men-of-war coming from any of the above-mentioned places, will be subject to a quarantine of nine days, to commence after the disinfection of the vessel.

Vessels passing through the Suez Canal without communicating with the ports will be admitted to free pratique.

The Board of Trade have also received through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, a copy of a Telegram from the Acting Governor of Gibraltar, reporting that quarantine regulations, similar to those adopted at Malta, have been adopted at the former place.

The Agent and Consul-General also reports that, in consequence of a quarantine having been imposed in Greece upon certain countries, arrivals from Greek ports direct, with clean bills of health from the Greek sanitary authorities, will be admitted to free pratique in Egypt.
