Any Lady who proposes to be presented must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the name be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to Her Royal Highness.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

THE following Despatches have been received
at the India Office:—

From Major-General F. S. Roberts, C.B., V.C.,
Commanding the Kuram Field Force, to the
Quartermaster-General in India, Army Head
Quarters.—(Dated Camp Matun, Khost Valley,
the 10th January, 1879.)

I HAVE the honour to submit, for the informa-
tion of his Excellency the Commander-in-Chief
and of the Government of India, the following
narrative of the circumstances attending the occu-
pation of the Khost District by the force under
my command.

2. On the 2nd January I marched from Hazar
Pir with the undermentioned troops; viz:—

Squadron 10th Royal Hussars.

Wing 72nd Highlanders (200 men).

Three troops 5th Punjab Cavalry.

No. 1 Mountain Battery.

No. 2

21st Punjab Native Infantry.

28th Punjab Native Infantry.

Colonel Barry Drew (with the 1st Infantry Brigade
Staff) was in command of the infantry portion of
the column, Colonel H. Gough, C.B., V.C., of
the Cavalry, and Lieutenant-Colonel A. Lindsay,
R.A., of the Artillery.

3. The first march, 10½ miles, was to Jaji
Maidan. The road passed over open rolling hills,
and presented no difficulties: it could easily be
made practicable for wheeled guns.

Jaji Maidan consists of a cluster of about ten
small villages situated in a basin formed by low
hills.

The troops had to encamp in the rice fields,
which are dry and suitable for the purpose at this
season, but it would be almost impossible to place
troops any where near the village during rainy
weather. The people of Jaji Maidan were very
civil, and the camp was abundantly supplied with
fuel, milk, fowls, &c.

4. The next day the column marched to Nar,
one of the Bakh group of villages at the northern
end of the Khost District. The road lay for five
miles up an open valley with low hills on each side,
easily accessible by infantry, and with several
small villages scattered about, until a kotal, or
pass was reached which commanded a view of
part of the Khost Plain. The ascent to the Kotal
is easy and open, but the descent on the Khost
side is, for a short distance, very rough and steep.
The hills close in on the road at this point, and
though they are easily practicable for infantry,
and are free from forest, yet the broken nature of
the ground renders this part of the route defen-
sible, and if held by an enemy, strong detachments
of infantry would be required to crown the heights
on each side of the pass.

These remarks apply, of course, with increased
force to an advance made from below, *i.e.*, the
Khost side. This difficult part of the road only
continues for about four miles, when the bed of a
wide nullah is reached, which opens gradually.
The total distance from Jaji Maidan to the village
of Nar is about 11 miles.

5. As I had received information that the
Mangals might possibly attempt to attack my
baggage while marching through the pass, and as
the camels could not possibly arrive in our camp
until long after dark, I resolved to halt the Com-
missariat convoy (which carried 15 days' pro-
visions for the column, and consisted of nearly
900 camels) at the village of Dhani, situated about
a mile on the Jaji Maidan side of the Kotal. A

squadron of the 5th Punjab Cavalry, No. 1 Mountain Battery, and the 21st Punjab Native Infantry, were also halted there as an escort for the convoy. The whole joined our camp at Nar the next morning, without having been molested on the road.

6. The column halted at Nar on the 4th January.

7. On the 5th January we marched six miles over a perfectly open and level plain to the village of Khubi.

8. Mahamad Akram Khan, the Afghan Deputy Governor of the Khost District, came into our camp to-day, accompanied by a small escort.

I had been in correspondence with him for several weeks, and he had agreed to maintain order in Khost until our arrival, stipulating in return that we should guarantee his personal safety, and allow him subsequently to proceed either to Kabul or to British territory, as he might desire. To these conditions I had agreed, in the hope that by this means our occupation of the Khost Valley might be accomplished without bloodshed, and with the least possible disturbance to the settled Government of the country. It also seemed desirable that we should obtain possession of the fort at Matun uninjured, and of the office records which Mahamad Akram Khan was reported to possess, and which it was believed would afford full details regarding the revenues which the Amir derived from both the Khost and Kuram Valleys.

Before marching from Hazar Pir I sent a letter to Mahamad Akram Khan, informing him of our intended advance, and requesting him to meet me at the village of Khubi. This he did, and on his arrival in camp I received him in Durbar. He then returned to Matun.

9. On the 6th January the column marched to Matun, and encamped outside the Afghan fort. The road, after passing for three miles across an open plain, led over a kotal, and then for about two miles through some low hills till the plain was reached, in which are situated Matun and numerous other villages.

The whole district is richly cultivated, and produces large quantities of rice, wheat, &c.

The people also possess considerable herds of cattle and sheep. The total distance from Khubi to the Afghan Fort is about eight miles.

10. Mahamad Akram Khan met me on the march half-way, and conducted me to the fort, which was found to be in indifferent order, and of the same general plan, as, but smaller than, the fort at Kuram.

The garrison consisted of 200 matchlock-men (Jezailchis), who received me at the entrance.

11. Since our entry into the Khost Valley I had remarked that, though no disturbance had occurred, an uneasy feeling was apparent among the inhabitants.

Some of the most influential Maliks had not come to pay their respects until sent for, and others who met us on the road had asked for permission to return to their homes before they had even accompanied me to our camp. It was very evident in short that the arrival of a British force was not a welcome event to the inhabitants of the country, but I hoped that after a time the people would become reassured, and that, as had happened with the Turis and Jajis, our presence would be accepted as inevitable, and even ultimately as a change for the better.

12. The cause of this state of feeling soon became apparent. After my arrival at Matun Fort, Mahamad Akram Khan took an early opportunity of informing me that the Mullahs, of

which this province possesses a large number, famous for their learning and fanaticism, had been actively engaged in raising religious prejudices against us, and in calling on the people to collect, attack our camp, and endeavour to expel us from the country.

13. There can be no doubt that such exhortations were powerfully aided by the apparent weakness of our force, the small numbers of which seemed in the popular judgment quite inadequate for the occupation of an extensive country such as Khost. The Mullahs, moreover, securely counted on the assistance of the neighbouring hill tribes; and in this they were not disappointed.

14. Mahamad Akram Khan stated that he had received information of large numbers of Mangals assembling; that they were being joined by some of the inhabitants of the Khost valley; and that it was very probable our camp would be attacked that night.

15. I therefore strengthened the usual picquets, and took every military precaution that the circumstances seemed to require.

16. I also sent for the Maliks of the neighbouring villages, and requested Colonel Waterfield to address purwanas to them to the effect that if our camp was attacked, summary and severe retribution would be exacted from all who had given admittance to Mangals or other persons having hostile intentions towards us. This measure had the desired effect, for before midnight nearly all the Matun Maliks came into camp, and informed me that the Mangals had departed for their homes, and that they themselves would remain in our camp as hostages for the good behaviour of the villagers. The night passed quietly.

17. On the following morning I sent some of the Maliks to ascertain whether the Mangals had really dispersed. They returned with the information that the men had started for their homes as they had promised, but being met by large numbers of their tribesmen on their way to Matun, the men had returned; that considerable numbers of Mangals and other hill-men were now present in the valley; that before long several thousands would be collected; and that our camp would certainly be attacked at night.

18. On receiving this intelligence I sent out a troop of the 5th Punjab Cavalry, under Major J. C. Stewart, accompanied by Captain Carr, Deputy-Assistant Quartermaster-General, to endeavour to ascertain the real position of affairs. The troop had not ridden two miles from our camp when it was fired upon, and soon after the first shots were heard, it became clear that the enemy, numbering certainly several thousands, had collected round three sides of our camp.

19. It was evident to me that the time had arrived when prompt and vigorous action was required to ensure our safety. The strength of the column which amounted to about 2,000 men, all told, was insignificant in comparison with the number we might find arrayed against us; we were separated by many miles of difficult country from our nearest support; and I judged it to be a matter of urgent necessity that the tribes who had dared to organize an attack on our camp should receive speedy and severe punishment.

20. In the first instance I reinforced Major Stewart's troop with all the cavalry at my disposal, under Colonel Hugh Gough, C.B., V.C., retaining in camp only 25 sabres of the 5th Punjab Cavalry. I also sent six companies of the 28th Punjab Native Infantry and No. 2 Mountain Battery in support of the cavalry.

These troops operated to the north-west of the

camp where the enemy appeared to have the greatest strength.

21. The right or eastern flank of the camp was protected by a wing of the 21st Punjab Native Infantry, under Major F. W. Collis, and two guns of No. 1 Mountain Battery.

The other wing of the 21st Punjab Native Infantry, under Captain J. G. T. Carruthers, and the remaining two guns of No. 1 Mountain Battery, covered the rear of the camp, while the front and left flank were defended by the wing of the 72nd Highlanders, under Lieutenant-Colonel W. H. J. Clarke.

The whole of the troops in and around the camp were placed under command of Colonel Drew.

22. I directed Colonel Drew merely to hold his own until Colonel Gough had disposed of the enemy in his front.

23. This task Colonel Gough performed in a very admirable manner, as detailed in the annexed report. Dismounting part of his force he engaged the enemy, drove him up into the higher ranges of the hills, and kept him well in check until the infantry and guns arrived. Colonel Gough then assumed command of all the troops in that part of the field, retired his cavalry under cover of the infantry and artillery fire, and formed them up in the plain, ready to cover the withdrawal of the infantry when the time for doing so should arrive.

The squadron of the 10th Hussars under Major T. J. W. Bulkeley did good service on this occasion, and killed many of the enemy by their carbine fire.

The conduct of the 5th Punjab Cavalry under Major Williams was not less steady.

The guns of No. 2 Mountain Battery under Captain G. Swinley were extremely well served, and their fire was very effective.

The 28th Punjab Native Infantry, who were commanded by Lieutenant-Colonel J. Hudson, had my orders not to follow the enemy into the hills. The regiment executed to my satisfaction the duty of keeping him in check.

24. Having satisfied myself that we had completely repulsed the enemy on our north-west side, I returned to the camp and ordered Colonel Drew to carry the villages on our right and rear, from which the enemy had fired on the troops; and to burn them as a punishment to the inhabitants for having given shelter to our assailants.

25. During this operation the troops of the 5th Punjab Cavalry, under Major Stewart, which I brought with me from Colonel Gough's command, made a very effective charge on a number of the enemy, who were escaping from the rear of a village on which the infantry were advancing, and killed about twenty of them.

26. Before it was dark all the troops had been withdrawn to camp, and so completely had the enemy been beaten that they did not venture to following up our retiring troops, according to the usual Pathan custom. Indeed, from the first moment our men opened fire, it was evident that the enemy could not stand in front of our rifles.

27. In the evening I sent for the head-men of the Matun villages, and told them that they had brought this punishment on themselves; that it was my earnest desire to have avoided all bloodshed; and that they must now see the futility of attempting to withstand disciplined troops, however small the number might appear to them to be.

28. The punishment that these people have received has been severe, but the lesson was certainly needed, and I have every reason to expect that the results will be satisfactory.

The principal head-men of the valley have already come into camp, and others from more distant parts of the country are said to be on their way. In the meantime I am neglecting no means to assure the people that they have nothing to fear from us so long as they abstain from hostile acts. That, on the contrary, it is the desire of the British Government to treat the people of this country with forbearance and consideration, and that this force has entered Khost with the sole view of ousting the Government of the Amir of Cabul.

29. There is evidence that the combination against us was wide-spread, and that if a severe example had not been made of those who fought against us on the 7th instant, the ill feeling would have extended. It might, under those circumstances, have become impossible to leave any portion of my small column here. The aspect of affairs has now changed; the head-men of nearly all the neighbouring villages have come in, and the remainder are reported to be anxious to submit. This, of course, is all that is required, and Colonel Waterfield agrees with me in thinking that an adequate force could now be left here with safety, provided that the troops in the Kuram Valley are maintained in sufficient strength to keep open our long line of communication.

30. I purpose therefore to leave the under-mentioned troops in the Matun Fort at this place, viz. :—

Half a Mountain Battery.

Two troops Native Cavalry.

A regiment of Native Infantry.

31. Regarding the detailed arrangements which are necessary for the safety and supply of this detachment, I will do myself the honour to address you in a few days.

32. In conclusion I have to report that I have every reason to be satisfied with the steady conduct of the troops, notwithstanding that they were acting against vastly superior forces.

From the Brigadier-General H. Gough, C.B., V.C., Commanding Cavalry Brigade, Kuram Field Force, to the Assistant Quartermaster-General, Kuram Field Force—(Dated Camp Matun, Khost Valley, the 9th January, 1879).

I HAVE the honour to submit the following report in connection with the cavalry under my command, concerned in the affair in the neighbourhood of this camp on the 7th instant.

1. On the morning of the 7th instant, information having been received that the Mangals, Waziris, and other tribes on this frontier, were assembling in force towards the west or left front of our camp, with the intention of making a combined attack on our position, I received orders from the Major-General Commanding Kuram Field Force to send out a small party of cavalry to reconnoitre the ground from left, and ascertain the truth of the report.

2. I accordingly detached a troop, strength as per margin,* under Major J. C. Stewart, 5th Punjab Cavalry, accompanied by Captain Carr, Deputy Assistant Quartermaster-General, to proceed in the direction indicated. They soon sent in intelligence that the enemy was in strong force in the cluster of walled villages to our left front, generally known as "Matun," and that on the approach of our small body of cavalry they began to pour out in large numbers, and to open fire upon them; the latter having now reached a

distance of between two and three miles from our camp.

3. The enemy taking advantage of the very broken ground and the low hills, made it their object to try and work round the cavalry, whose position now became somewhat critical; and under instructions from Major-General Roberts, C.B., V.C., Commanding the Force, I ordered out the remainder of the cavalry in camp (consisting of one squadron 10th Royal Hussars and a wing of the 5th Punjab Cavalry, strength as per margin,* (the former under Major Bulkeley and the 5th Punjab Cavalry under Major Williams), to proceed to support.

4. Accompanying the cavalry in the direction where Major Stewart was engaged with the enemy, I found the latter in strong force (at that time apparently about a thousand strong though much scattered, and subsequently reinforced by at least five hundred more), in possession of the low hills at the foot of the mountains, and occupying a strong position.

5. I at once ordered the 10th Hussars up to the foot of some advanced rising ground, which afforded excellent cover, and they dismounting, quickly took up an excellent position on the crest of the low mounds, and opened a steady and well-directed fire on the enemy. Major Williams also, under my direction, brought up the 5th Punjab Cavalry to the foot of some low detached hills on our right, and also opened a brisk fire from dismounted men.

The effect of this combined movement was that the enemy began to retire, and I again advanced the troops, the 10th Hussars taking up an excellent position for dismounted work on a low hill, and opening fire on the enemy's right, whilst a troop of the 5th Punjab Cavalry made a brilliant charge up another hill in the centre of the enemy's position, and, rapidly dismounting, commenced to harass them in their retreat. This charge, which was personally led by Major Williams, struck me as one of the most gallant episodes in cavalry warfare I had ever seen. The remainder of the 5th Punjab Cavalry also advanced under good cover, and maintained a heavy and effective fire.

6. At this period, another force of the enemy began to pour out of the villages to our left and left front, and tried to work across to reinforce those with whom we were engaged; but foreseeing their object, I detached a troop of the 10th Hussars under Captain Barker to move to the left, and take up a position under cover of some low shrubs and trees, from which he was able to open an accurate and very effective fire, which rapidly dispersed them. This fire was especially effective as the enemy were completely in the open; and from our position we could plainly see the shot falling among them, and the occurrence of several casualties in their ranks.

7. The other troop of the 10th Hussars now advanced to a more advanced position, and kept up a well-sustained fire on the retreating enemy, who were working their way up the rocks and crags in the greatest confusion, and never ceasing their flight till they got shelter behind the sky line of the highest ridges.

8. The 28th Punjab Infantry under Lieutenant-Colonel Hudson, and No. 2 Mountain Battery under Captain Swinley, R.A., now arrived on the scene of action, having been despatched by the Major-General Commanding to our assistance. The cavalry had, however, done their work so effectually, that the enemy had retired out of rifle range.

The infantry now relieved the cavalry from the positions they held in the hill sides, and the Mountain Battery commenced shelling the enemy on the mountain top, making excellent practice, and completely preventing them from making any show.

9. Meantime, whilst the above had been proceeding on our left and left front, another attack on the enemy had developed itself on the left rear of our camp, and Major Stewart, with his small party of the 5th Punjab Cavalry, had gradually worked round, through the broken ground and nullahs, to the scene of action. Here he hovered about the enemy, harassing them most effectually, and, under the orders of the Major-General Commanding, he was enabled to make a very gallant and successful charge on a large force of the retreating enemy, driving them in utter rout in all directions. That his troopers did their work right well is proved by the fact that upwards of twenty bodies were found on the ground dead from sabre wounds, whilst probably as many more escaped wounded.

10. The enemy on our left and left front having retreated to the mountain tops, I now, under instructions from the Major-General Commanding, commenced a gradual retirement of the force under my command, which we did very slowly and steadily, under cover of the mountain guns and alternate retirements of the infantry, the cavalry on the left flank being held in readiness to make a dash, should the enemy attempt to follow us in the open ground. However, no attack, or even any attempt to follow, was made on their part, a fact, I believe, almost unprecedented in hill warfare.

It would be impossible to make more than a conjecture at the enemy's loss in this attack, but I should be inclined to put down their casualties as pretty considerable, and I think I am borne out in this conjecture by the fact of their being too beaten to attempt harassing us in any way.

11. When the retirement was completed, I received orders to take the cavalry to the left rear, and see if we could pursue the retreating enemy, but, after a gallop of about three miles over a rough country, we arrived only to find that the villages had been deserted by the enemy, who were now quite of sight.

12. Darkness now setting in, and the country being unsuited to cavalry, as well as the fact that that the enemy had got too great a start of us, precluded all idea of further pursuit, and I therefore ordered all the troops under my command to return to camp.

13. In conclusion, I would beg to recommend to the favourable consideration of the Major-General Commanding the following officers who came under my command during the day's operations.

Lieutenant-Colonel Hudson, Commanding 28th Punjab Infantry, who brought up his fine regiment in excellent formation and most steadily to our support.

Major B. Williams, Commanding 5th Punjab Cavalry, who throughout the day was of the greatest assistance to me in every way, and whose brilliant charge I have already noticed.

Major J. C. Stewart, 5th Punjab Cavalry, commanding a detached troop of his regiment and who distinguished himself greatly under the personal command of the Major-General Commanding the Force.

Major Bulkeley, Commanding the Squadron, 10th Royal Hussars, who showed a fine example to his men of steadiness under circumstances so novel in cavalry warfare, and also Captain Barker of the

same regiment, who commanded a detached troop well and effectively.

Captain Swinley, Royal Artillery Commanding No. 2, Mountain Battery, who did excellent work with his guns and materially assisted our retirement.

My thanks are also due to my personal staff during the day, viz., Captain Carr, Deputy Assistant Quartermaster-General and Lieutenant J. P. Brabazon, Officiating Brigade-Major of Cavalry, who were with me throughout the operations and afforded me every assistance.

The excellent and steady conduct of the troops, both European and Native, was above all praise.

GENERAL ORDER of Local Government Board: Rate Accounts (39 and 40 Vict., c. 61, s. 37).

To the Overseers of the Poor of every Parish in England and Wales;—
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 37 of "The Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876" (39 and 40 Vict., cap. 61), which was passed on the 15th day of August, 1876, it is enacted as follows:—

"From and after the twenty-fifth day of March next, when an Overseer shall make and levy any rate or assessment which is not now subject to be audited by the District Auditor, or by any Auditor or Auditors appointed under or by virtue of the Metropolitan Local Management Act, such rate or assessment, and the accounts relating thereto, shall be submitted by him, and by the Collector thereof, if any, to the said Auditor, in the like manner, and with the like incidents, consequences, liabilities, and power of appeal as in the case of the Poor Rate made by such Overseer; and every other audit of every such rate or assessment, if any, shall cease."
"And the Local Government Board shall have the same power to make orders to regulate the keeping of such accounts as they have in regard to other local rates."

Now therefore, we, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby order as follows:—

ART. 1. In every case in which, after the twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, any Rate as defined in this Order shall be made and levied by Overseers in any parish or any part thereof, the following Regulations shall be observed, except in so far as we may from time to time assent to any departure therefrom.

ART. 2. In this Order—

"Rate" means any rate or assessment coming within the provisions of Section 37 of the "Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876," above recited.

"Rateable Value" includes net annual value and any other basis of value on which a Rate is required to be assessed.

"Overseer" means any person to whom the word "Overseer" in the section above recited applies, and the word "Overseers" applies not only to the whole body of Overseers, but also to the majority of that body.

"Collector" means any person lawfully appointed or employed to collect any Rate to which this Order applies.

"Parish" means any place for which a separate Poor Rate shall or can be made or for which a separate Overseer is or can be appointed.

KEEPING OF ACCOUNTS.

Overseers.

ART. 3. The Overseers shall (except so far as such books may be kept under their direction by any Collector) punctually enter and accurately keep according to the forms and directions in the Schedule to this Order—

A *Rate Book*, in the Form (No. 1) in the said Schedule. In this book shall be inserted the particulars of the assessment and collection of the

Rate and the Heading or Title of the Rate as set forth in the Form; and the Overseers shall, before any sum of money in respect of the said Rate is collected, sign a declaration, in the terms or to the effect set forth in the said Form.

Provided, that in any case where Overseers make a Rate as defined in this Order on the same day on which they make a Poor Rate, and where such Rate as defined in this Order is made over an area no part of which is outside the area over which the said Poor Rate is made, then the said Rate as defined in this Order may be made in the same Book and on the same pages thereof as the said Poor Rate, if the two regulations next following and marked (a) and (b) be observed.

(a.) On each of the several pages containing the said Poor Rate there shall be added after the last column thereof, the several columns numbered from 7 to 16, both inclusive, in the Form No. 1 in the said Schedule.

(b.) After the heading of the said Poor Rate, and before the commencement of the columns thereof and of the Rate as defined in this Order, the form of heading prescribed in the said Form (No. 1) in the said Schedule shall be inserted, and immediately after the signatures to the form of declaration appended to the said Poor Rate, the form of declaration prescribed in the said Form (No. 1) in the said Schedule shall be added.

(c.) Whether the Rate as defined in this Order be made in a separate Book or in the same Book with a Poor Rate, the several columns of *The Rate Book* which are numbered 7, 8, 10, and 11 respectively in the said Form (No. 1), shall be added up at the foot of every page, and the several totals shall be ascertained and set forth at the foot of the Rate, before any sum of money in respect of the said Rate is collected.

(d.) If the Overseers shall deem it convenient, the Rate may be divided into several portions corresponding with the several divisions of the parish, if any, so as to bring all the rateable property of each division together, and there may be separate series of numbers for the assessments in every division, and they may in like manner bring together in the Rate separate classes of rateable property.

A *Rate Receipt and Payment Book*, in the Form (No. 2) in the said Schedule. On one side of this book shall be entered an account of all moneys received by the Overseers in respect of the Rate, and on the other side, with the proper dates, an account of all moneys paid and expended by them in respect thereof; and the Overseers shall sign the same in the place prescribed in the said Form.

A *Rate Receipt Check Book*, in the Form (No. 3) in the said Schedule. The receipts and counterfoils shall be numbered consecutively with numbers corresponding with those in the Rate Book, and the Overseers shall cause a *Demand Note* to be printed in the *Rate Receipt Check Book*, in the Form prescribed in the said Schedule, and the Demand Notes shall be numbered so as to correspond with the numbers of the respective receipts.

ART. 4. When the amount of the Rate shall be received from any person assessed, at that time and not before, the receipt applicable to such person's assessment shall be detached from the Rate Receipt Check Book, and the same shall be delivered, stamped with an adhesive stamp where the amount of the payment shall render such

stamp necessary, to the person paying the same, and the counterfoil shall be retained in the book. In the receipt so delivered and in the counterfoil so retained the true date of the payment of the money shall be inserted.

If upon the closing of any rate not collected by a Collector there shall remain in the Rate Receipt Check Book any receipts made out for such rate unused, the Overseers shall enter upon each of such receipts the reason of its not having been used, and date and sign such entry.

Collector.

ART. 5. Every Collector shall enter up so much of any Books or Forms of the Overseers relating to the collection of the Rate as he may be directed to enter up by the Overseers for the time being, and shall enter in the *Rate Book* all such particulars of every assessment as he shall be directed by such Overseers to enter therein; and every Collector shall attend before the Auditor at the same time as the Overseers of the parish for which he acts.

Provided that the signature of any Collector to any book presented to the Auditor shall not be taken to stand for or supply the place of the signature of any Overseer which may be required by this Order.

ART. 6. Every Collector shall in all cases fill up and use as is hereinbefore directed in the case of Overseers, the *Rate Receipt Check Book*, in the Form (No. 3) hereinbefore prescribed.

ART. 7. The Collector, before he shall proceed to collect any Rate, shall prepare receipts in one book, or in several, if so directed by the Overseers, in the aforesaid Form, numbered both on the receipt and the counterfoil thereof with the same number consecutively throughout the book, and properly fill in the same respectively with the names of the several ratepayers, and the sum to be collected from each, and submit every such Rate Receipt Check Book, so numbered and filled up, to the Overseers before he proceeds to collect the Rate; and such Overseers shall cause the correctness of the numbering, and the correspondence of the sums, and of the names filled in, with the Rate Book to which they relate, to be ascertained, and on the leaf next after the last of the receipts so made out in respect of any one Rate the Overseers shall certify the fact that such Rate Receipt Check Book has been examined and ascertained to be correct, and shall state in words at length the number of receipts filled up for the rate then to be collected, which Certificate shall be in the Form set forth in the said Schedule, and shall be signed by the Overseers and correctly dated.

If upon the closing of any Rate collected by a Collector there shall remain in the Rate Receipt Check Book any receipts made out for such rate unused, the Collector to whom such book shall belong shall enter upon each of such receipts the reason of its not having been used, and date and sign such entry.

ART. 8. The Collector shall pay over all moneys collected by him in respect of the Rate to the Overseers or their banker at intervals of not more than a month, and also whenever he has Fifty Pounds in his hands, or more frequently if the Overseers so direct him; and he shall keep a book, to be called the *Collecting and Deposit Book*, in the Form (No. 4) in the said Schedule, in which shall be entered accurately, and under their true dates, all sums received and deposited or paid by him as such Collector, and also the number of every receipt given by him as such Collector out of the *Rate Receipt Check Book*, and he shall balance such book

monthly, at the times specified in Art. 9; and any Overseer who shall receive any money from such Collector shall write his initials against the entry of the sum so deposited with him.

ART. 9. The Collector shall keep a book containing blank Forms of *Monthly Statements*, in the Form (No. 5) in the said Schedule, and shall every month fill up one of such statements with the several particulars set forth in the said form, which statement shall be made up to the last day of every calendar month inclusive, excepting in the case of the month of March, when it shall be made up to the 25th, and in that of the month of September, when it shall be made up to the 29th; so that any receipts or payments on the remaining days of those months respectively shall be included in the next monthly statement; and he shall forthwith deliver a copy of such statement, signed by himself, to one of the Overseers.

Provided that the Overseers may, if they think fit, require a statement, containing the several particulars set forth in the said form, to be made out and delivered to them respectively every week or fortnight.

The Overseer who receives the statement shall enter his initials in the column against the amount stated to be paid to the Overseers, if he shall have received the sum there mentioned; and he shall mark on such statement the date of his receipt thereof, and preserve the copies delivered to him, and produce the same to the Auditor at the next audit.

ART. 10. The Collector shall, previous to each audit, make out an *Unpaid Rates Statement*, in the Form (No. 6) in the said Schedule, containing a statement of the Rates allowed during the last half year, with the dates of their allowance, and showing the name of every person rated in respect of whom there shall be at the end of the half year for which the audit is being held, any arrears of the Rate or Rates made before that in the course of collection on the last day of that half year, with the other particulars set forth in the form. He shall submit such Statement to one of the Overseers for his signature, and shall produce the same to the Auditor at the audit.

ART. 11. In every case in which there shall be more than one Collector employed in the collection of any one Rate, the provisions of the several Articles hereinbefore made shall apply to the portion of such rate assigned to each Collector as if such portion were one entire Rate.

EXAMINATION AND CLOSING OF ACCOUNTS.

ART. 12. The Overseers or the Collector, as the case may be, shall make up and balance the Rate Book and the Receipt and Payment Book to the twenty-fifth day of March and the twenty-ninth day of September in each year.

ART. 13. The Overseers shall, as soon as they shall receive notice from the Auditor of the day or days appointed by him for the auditing of their accounts, cause the following notice to be affixed on the place or places where parochial notices are usually affixed, and shall continue the same so affixed until the audit is completed:—

deposited at _____; and that such Accounts will be open to be inspected, examined, and copied by any owner of property or ratepayer having an interest in such Accounts, at any reasonable hour in the day-time, until the _____ day of _____; and that on the last-mentioned day, at the hour of _____, the Accounts will be audited by _____ at _____, when and where every such owner of property or ratepayer, who may have any objection to any matter contained in the above-mentioned Accounts, may attend, and prefer his objection, and the same will be heard and determined by the Auditor.

ART. 14. The Overseers shall, seven clear days before the day appointed for auditing the Accounts, deposit the said Accounts at the place appointed, and shall permit the said accounts to be inspected, examined, and copied by any owner of property or ratepayer having an interest in the said Accounts, at any reasonable hour in the day-time, after the said Accounts shall have been so deposited, and previous to the day appointed for the audit.

ART. 15. In case the auditing of any of the Accounts shall be adjourned for any longer period than from day to day; the Overseers, on receiving from the Auditor notice thereof, shall affix, in manner aforesaid, notice of the time and place of such adjournment, and of the Accounts remaining to be audited, as often as such adjournment shall be made.

AUDITING OF ACCOUNTS.

ART. 16. The Auditor shall audit the Accounts of the Overseers and of the Collector once in every half-year, that is to say, as soon as may be after the twenty-fifth day of March and the twenty-ninth day of September. Provided always, that if the Auditor shall be required by the Local Government Board to hold an extraordinary audit, either of the whole or of any portion of the Accounts, in addition to the ordinary audit, all the provisions herein contained, with reference to the ordinary audit, shall, as far as they may be applicable, apply to such extraordinary audit.

ART. 17. The Auditor, in respect of every ordinary audit, shall give to the Overseers and the Collector fourteen days' notice in writing of the time and place on and at which he intends to commence the audit of the Accounts.

ART. 18. The Overseers and the Collector shall attend at the time and place appointed by the Auditor for the audit of their Accounts, and shall submit to the Auditor all books, documents, and vouchers containing or relating to their Accounts; and the same shall at the time of the audit be open to the inspection of any owner of property or ratepayer having an interest in such Accounts, but to such extent and in such manner only as will not, in the judgment of the said Auditor, interfere with the audit.

ART. 19. In auditing the Accounts, the Auditor shall see that they have been kept and are presented in proper form; that the particular items of receipt and expenditure are stated in sufficient detail, and that the payments are supported by adequate vouchers and authority; and he shall ascertain whether all sums received, or which ought to have been received, are brought into

account; and he shall examine whether the expenditure is in all cases such as might lawfully be made; and he shall reduce such payments and charges as are exorbitant; shall surcharge moneys not duly accounted for, or lost by negligence, upon the person who ought to account for the same, or whose negligence or improper conduct has caused the loss; and shall disallow and strike out such payments as are not authorised by law.

ART. 20. When the Auditor disallows any payment or surcharges any sum upon any person he shall declare the ground of his decision, and offer to state such ground in writing, if required by the person aggrieved to do so, in the proper book of account forthwith, or so soon as the arrangements for the business of his audit will permit, and shall report such disallowance or surcharge to the Local Government Board.

ART. 21. The Auditor shall examine and collate the several books and papers of Account; and shall ascertain that the several entries correspond with and balance each other, where such balance may be required; but in case of any error caused by inadvertence or accident in any account he may require the Overseers or Collector rendering it to correct the same, and the Overseers or Collector shall make the necessary correction, and the Auditor shall then deal with the account so corrected. But if the Overseers or Collector shall refuse to do so, the Auditor shall himself make the correction, and report the circumstances of the case to the Local Government Board.

ART. 22. The Auditor shall compute the several Accounts so as to verify the arithmetical accuracy thereof, and the balance due to or from the Overseers or the Collector at the time to which the audit relates; and he shall state the balance in words at length, and certify the same by his signature or initials, and add the date of the audit; and when he certifies any sum or other matter to be due he shall, as far as practicable, enter his certificate and his reasons for the same (when they are required) in some part of the book of account, which shall be free from other writing.

ART. 23. The Auditor shall receive any objection made by a ratepayer, or any person aggrieved, against the Accounts undergoing audit, or any item or charge therein, or any vouchers or authority for the same, and shall examine into the merits of such objection, and make a decision respecting the same, stating the grounds thereof, and offering to enter the same in the book of account then being examined, if required to do so, as in the case of a disallowance or surcharge.

ART. 24. The personal representatives of an Overseer or Collector accountable under this Order, dying before the audit of his Accounts, shall, so far as they may be by law required, account, in conformity with the provisions herein contained, in the place of such deceased Overseer or Collector; and all regulations affecting the Accounts of such Overseer or Collector shall, so far as may be otherwise lawful, affect the Accounts of his personal representatives.

ART. 25. The Auditor shall, at the close of each audit, transmit to the Local Government Board a statement in the Form (No. 7) in the said Schedule, showing which of the Books directed by this Order to be kept is not kept, or is imperfectly kept, or kept in a form different from that prescribed by the Local Government Board.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Altering Consolidated Order: Out-door Labour Test:—

Helston Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Helston Union, in the county of Cornwall;—

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the several parishes comprised in the said Union;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WE, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the statutes in that behalf, hereby order, with respect to the relief of the poor in the Helston Union, in the county of Cornwall, as follows:

ARTICLE 1. Every able-bodied male pauper who may receive relief within the Union, and may be relieved out of the Workhouse, with the approbation of the Local Government Board, according to Article VI of a General Order of the Poor Law Board, dated the 6th day of January, 1857, addressed (amongst others) to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Union, shall be relieved in the following manner; that is to say:—

Half at least of the relief given to such pauper shall be given in food, clothing, and other articles of necessity.

No such pauper shall receive relief from the Guardians of the Union, or any of their officers, or any Overseer of any Parish in the Union, while he is employed for wages or other hire or remuneration by any person; but every such pauper so relieved shall be set to work by the Guardians.

ARTICLE 2. The Guardians shall, within fourteen days after the day when this Order comes into force, and from time to time afterwards as the Local Government Board may require, report to the Local Government Board the place or places at which able-bodied male paupers shall be so set to work in the Union, the sort or sorts of work in which they or any of them shall be employed, the times and mode of work, and all such other matters relating to the employment of such able-bodied paupers as the said Guardians shall deem material to be communicated to the Local Government Board, or as the Local Government Board shall require.

ARTICLE 3. If the Guardians of the Union shall depart, in any particular instance, from any of the regulations hereinbefore contained, and shall, within fifteen days after such departure, report the same and the grounds thereof to the Local Government Board, and if the Local Government Board shall approve of such departure, then the relief granted in such particular instance shall, if otherwise lawful, not be deemed to be unlawful, or be subject to be disallowed.

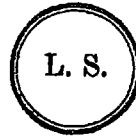
ARTICLE 4. Whenever the word "Parish" is used in this Order, it shall be taken to signify any place for which a separate Poor Rate is or can be made, or for which a separate Overseer is or can be appointed.

And whereas provision is made in a General Order of the Poor Law Commissioners, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, addressed, (amongst others) to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Union, for the appointment of an officer, to be termed a Superintendent of Out-door Labour, and for the continuance in office of such officer, and it is expedient to provide for the sus-

pension of such officer on other occasions than those provided for by the last-mentioned Order;

Now therefore, We hereby further Order, that if at any time the number of able-bodied male paupers requiring relief shall be so small as to render the services of such an officer unnecessary, the Guardians may suspend him from the performance of his duties until a further occasion shall arise.
