**REGULATIONS**

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING ROOMS TO BE HELD, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, BY HER ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCESS OF WALES, AT BUCKINGHAM PALACE.

*By Her Majesty's Command,*

The Ladies, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Rooms, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to Her Royal Highness.

**PRESENTATIONS.**

Any Lady who proposes to be presented must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the pre-

sentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the name be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to Her Royal Highness.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

**W**HEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-eighth and thirty-ninth years of Our reign, intituled "The Militia (Voluntary Enlistment) Act, 1875," it is amongst other things enacted, that save as therein otherwise provided the Militia shall be trained and exercised for not less than twenty-one days and not more than twenty-eight days in every year, at such times and at such places in any part of the United Kingdom as Her Majesty may appoint; and also that Her Majesty may from time to time, with the advice of Her Privy Council, order that the period of training and exercise in any year, of all or any part of the

Militia, be reduced to such time as to Her Majesty, with the advice aforesaid may seem fit.

And whereas it is expedient that the training of the several Regiments of Militia of the United Kingdom should be reduced to the period of twenty days for the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

Now therefore, Her Majesty with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and direct that the period of training and exercise of the several regiments of Militia of the United Kingdom shall for the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine be reduced under the provisions of the said recited Act, from twenty-eight days to twenty days.

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS by an Act passed in the sixth year of the reign of King George the Fourth, entitled "An Act to repeal the several Laws relating to the performance of Quarantine, and to make other provisions in lieu thereof," it was enacted that all vessels, as well His Majesty's ships of war as others, coming from or having touched at any place from whence His Majesty, His heirs or successors, by and with the advice of His or their Privy Council, shall have adjudged and declared it probable that the Plague, or other infectious disease or distemper highly dangerous to the health of His Majesty's subjects, may be brought. And all vessels and boats receiving any person, goods, wares, and merchandize, packets, packages, baggage, wearing apparel, books, letters, or any other article whatsoever from or out of any vessel so coming from or having touched at such infected place as aforesaid, whether such persons, goods, wares, and merchandize, packets, packages, baggage, wearing apparel, books, letters, or other articles shall have come or been brought in such vessels, or such persons shall have gone, or articles have been put on board the same, either before or after the arrival of such vessels at any port or place in the United Kingdom, or the Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, and whether such vessels were or were not bound to any port or place in the United Kingdom, or the Islands aforesaid, and all persons, goods, wares, and merchandize, packets, packages, baggage, wearing apparel, books, letters, or any other article whatsoever, on board of any vessels so coming from or having touched at such infected place as aforesaid, or on board of any such receiving vessels or boats as aforesaid, shall be and be considered to be liable to quarantine within the meaning of this said Act, and of any Order or Orders which shall be made by His Majesty, His heirs and successors, by and with the advice of His or their Privy Council, concerning quarantine and the prevention of infection from the time of the departure of such vessels from such infected place as aforesaid, or from the time when such persons, goods, wares, merchandize, packets, packages, baggage, wearing apparel, books, letters, or other articles shall have been received on board respectively; and all such vessels and boats as aforesaid, and all persons (as well pilots as others), goods, wares, and merchandize, and all other articles as aforesaid, whether coming or brought

in such vessels or boats from such infected place as aforesaid, or going or being put on board the same either before or after the arrival of such vessels or boats at any port or place in the United Kingdom, or the Islands aforesaid, and all persons, goods, wares, and merchandize, and other articles as aforesaid, on board such receiving vessel or boat as aforesaid, shall, upon their arrival at such port or place, be obliged to perform quarantine in such place or places, for such time and in such manner as shall from time to time be directed by His Majesty, His heirs or successors, by His or their Order or Orders in Council, notified by proclamation or published in the London Gazette.

And by the said Act it was also enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the Lords and others of His Majesty's Privy Council, or any two or more of them, to make such Order as they shall see necessary and expedient upon any unforeseen emergency, or in any particular case or cases, with respect to any vessel arriving and having any infectious disease or distemper on board, or on board of which any infectious disease or distemper may have appeared in the course of the voyage, or arriving under any other alarming or suspicious circumstances as to infection, although such vessel shall not have come from any place which His Majesty, His heirs or successors, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, may have adjudged and declared it probable that the Plague, or any such infectious disease or distemper, may be brought, and also with respect to the persons, goods, wares, and merchandize, and other articles, as aforesaid, on board the same.

And by the said Act it was also enacted that all persons liable to perform quarantine, and all persons having had any intercourse or communication with them, shall be subject during the said quarantine, or during the time they shall be liable to quarantine, to such orders as they shall receive from the Superintendent of Quarantine, or his assistant, or from the Principal Officer of Customs at any port or place where there is no such superintendent or assistant, or from any other officer of the Customs authorized to act in that behalf:

And whereas His Majesty, under the authority of the said above-recited Act, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, on the 19th day of July, 1825, made an Order declaring it probable that the Plague, or some other infectious disease or distemper, might be brought into the United Kingdom, or the Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, by vessels coming from the Mediterranean and certain other places, with or without clean bills of health:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that all vessels coming from the aforesaid places should be liable to perform quarantine in manner in such Order directed:

Her Majesty, under the authority of the said above-recited Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, doth hereby adjudge and declare it probable that the Plague, or some other infectious disease or distemper highly dangerous to the health of Her Majesty's subjects, may be brought into the United Kingdom, or the Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, by vessels coming from the Baltic, or from the Black Sea, or from the Sea of Azoff, or from the Sea of Marmora, or from or having touched at any place in, or any place the passage from which is by or through, any of the said seas.

And Her Majesty is therefore pleased, under the authority of the said Act, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that all

vessels, persons, goods, wares, and merchandize, and all other articles hereby made liable to quarantine, shall perform the same at such places and for such times as shall be appointed, in that behalf by any Order of Her Majesty in Council, or of the Lords and others of the Privy Council, or any two or more of them, and shall be subjected to the provisions, rules, and regulations and restrictions contained in the said Act concerning Quarantine and the prevention of infection, and to all the pains and penalties, forfeitures and punishments contained in the said Act, or otherwise by law provided, for any breach or disobedience of the provisions of the said Act, or of any Order or Orders made or hereafter to be made in pursuance of the said Act, and that all persons hereby made liable to perform Quarantine, and all persons having had any intercourse or communication with them shall, upon arrival at any port or place in the United Kingdom, or in the Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, and during the said Quarantine, or during the time they shall be liable to Quarantine, observe and obey all such orders and directions as they shall receive from the Quarantine Officer at such port or place authorized to act in that behalf.

And it is hereby ordered that this Order shall take effect and be in force from and after the date hereof.

And the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of the Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," after reciting that, "Whereas from the increase of population, or from other circumstances, it may be expedient that two or more benefices which have been heretofore united or which may be hereafter united under the provisions of this Act should be disunited," it is amongst other things, enacted, "That when two or more benefices shall have been united, or may be hereafter united into one benefice, and with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop of the Province, that one or more of the benefices within his diocese, of which such united benefice shall consist, may be separated therefrom with advantage to the interests of religion, the said Archbishop shall enquire into the circumstances of the case; and if on such enquiry it shall appear to him that such union may be usefully dissolved, so far as respects such benefice or benefices, he shall six weeks at least before certifying such inquiry to Her Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own diocese, a statement, in writing, of the facts, and in all other cases a copy, in writing, of the aforesaid representation to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the church or in some public and conspicuous place in

"each of the benefices forming part of the united benefice, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they may within six weeks show cause, in writing, under his, her, or their hands to the said Archbishop against any such disunion; and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the Archbishop shall certify the inquiry and consent, when the patron's consent is necessary, to Her Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for Her Majesty to issue an Order for separating such last-mentioned benefice or benefices from such united benefice, and for declaring the rights of patronage of the several patrons, if there be more than one patron, and such Order shall be registered in the registry of the diocese to which such united benefice shall belong, which Order the Registrar of such diocese, immediately, on the receipt thereof, is hereby required to register accordingly, and thereupon immediately if such united benefice shall be then vacant, otherwise on the first avoidance thereof, such union shall be ipso-facto dissolved, so far only as regards such benefice or benefices so proposed to be separated from such united benefice, but in all other respects shall remain in full force and effect, and thenceforward such last-mentioned benefice or benefices shall be and be deemed and taken to be a separate and distinct benefice or benefices to all intents and purposes whatever as if no such union had taken place, and the patron or patrons thereof shall and may according to the terms of such Order present or nominate thereto respectively, and so from time to time upon each and every avoidance of the same: Provided always, that no benefices which have been united for more than sixty years before the passing of this Act shall be disunited without the consent in writing of the patron or patrons thereof."

And whereas the Lord Bishop of Chichester on the 1st day of January 1879 made a representation to the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury in the words following:—

"To the Most Reverend Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury.

"I Richard Lord Bishop of Chichester do hereby represent to your Grace that it appears to me that the disunion of the united benefice consisting of the vicarage of Preston and the vicarage of Hove in the county of Sussex and diocese of Chichester by the separation of the vicarage of Preston from the vicarage of Hove may be made with advantage to the interests of religion.

"Witness my hand the first day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

And whereas the said Lord Archbishop enquired into the circumstances of the case and on such enquiry it appeared to him that the said union might be usefully dissolved; he thereupon six weeks before certifying such enquiry to Her Majesty in Council caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation to be affixed to the principal outer door of each of the parish churches of the said united benefice with notice to any person or persons interested that he she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his her or their hand or hands against such disunion as required by the said Act. No such cause has been shown and the said Archbishop hath therefore pursuant to the said Act certified the enquiry and consent of the patron to the proposed disunion to Her Majesty in Council by his

certificate in writing bearing date the 28th day of February 1879, which certificate is in the words following:—

“To the QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

“We the undersigned Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury Primate of all England and Metropolitan do hereby certify to your Majesty in Council:

“That the Right Reverend Richard Lord Bishop of Chichester as Bishop of the diocese within which is situate the united benefice consisting of the vicarage of Preston and the vicarage of Hove in the county of Sussex having represented unto us that the disunion of the said united benefice by the separation of the said vicarage of Preston from the said vicarage of Hove might be made with advantage to the interests of religion we inquired into the circumstances of the case.

“That on such inquiry it appeared to us that such union might be usefully dissolved and that the said Lord Bishop of Chichester being the patron or person entitled to present to the said united benefice the same being now vacant consents to the proposed disunion.

“That six weeks and upwards before certifying such inquiry and consent to your Majesty in Council we caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed on the principal outer door of each of the parish churches of the said united benefice with notice to any person or persons interested that he she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his her or their hand or hands to us the said Archbishop against such disunion and no such cause has been shown.

“The representation of the said Lord Bishop of Chichester our inquiry into the circumstances of the case the reply thereto the consent in writing of the patron and the copies of the representation and notice before mentioned are hereunto annexed.

“And we do hereby certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to your Majesty in Council to the intent that your Majesty in Council may in case your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for dissolving the union of the said united benefice and for separating the said vicarage of Preston from the said vicarage of Hove.

“As witness our hand this twenty-eighth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

Now therefore Her Majesty in Council by and with the advice of Her said Council is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered that the said united benefice consisting of the vicarage of Preston and the vicarage of Hove shall be dissolved by separating the said vicarage of Preston from the said vicarage of Hove.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four,

duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the thirtieth day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, in the words and figures following; that is to say:

“We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of your Majesty chapter fifty; and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and twenty-four have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to a certain benefice namely the church and cure (being a vicarage) of Canewdon in the county of Essex and in the diocese of Saint Albans, by way of exchange for the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to two other benefices namely the church and cure (being a vicarage) of Hinckley and the two churches and cure (being a perpetual curacy or a vicarage) of Stoke Golding with Dadlington each of which benefices of Hinckley and Stoke Golding with Dadlington is in the county of Leicester and in the diocese of Peterborough.

“Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Canewdon is vested in the Bishop of the said diocese of Peterborough for the time being.

“And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to each of the said two benefices of Hinckley and Stoke Golding with Dadlington is vested in the Dean and Chapter of the Collegiate Church of Saint Peter at Westminster and in their successors.

“And whereas the Right Reverend William Connor now Bishop of the said diocese of Peterborough and the said Dean and Chapter of the said Collegiate Church of Saint Peter at Westminster have respectively signified to us their desire that the patronage of the said three benefices of Canewdon, Hinckley and Stoke Golding with Dadlington may be assigned and transferred by way of exchange in manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

“And whereas we have made due enquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative values of the said benefices and patronage and we do hereby certify to your Majesty that the circumstances and present values of the said benefices respectively are as set forth in the schedule hereto annexed.

“Now therefore with the consent of the said William Connor Bishop of the said diocese of Peterborough (in testimony whereof he the said Bishop has affixed his signature and episcopal seal to this scheme) and with the consent of the Very Reverend Arthur Penrhyn Stanley the Dean and the Chapter of the said Collegiate Church of Saint Peter at Westminster (in testimony whereof they the said Dean and Chapter have affixed their common or corporate seal to this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Canewdon now vested in the said William Connor Bishop of the said diocese of Peterborough as such Bishop as aforesaid, shall be transferred from him the said William Connor Bishop of the said diocese of Peterborough and from his successors



Bishops of the said diocese and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Dean and Chapter of the said Collegiate Church of Saint Peter at Westminster and their successors for ever and that in exchange for the same the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said two benefices of Hinckley and Stoke Golding with Dadlington and each of them now vested as aforesaid in the said Dean and Chapter of the said Collegiate Church of Saint Peter at Westminster shall thereupon and thenceforth be transferred from them the said

Dean and Chapter and from their successors and shall be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said William Connor Bishop of the said diocese of Peterborough and his successors Bishops of the same diocese for ever.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Saint Albans, and by the Registrar of the said diocese of Peterborough.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five; and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Her Majesty, chapter eighty-two; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council, a repre-

sentation, bearing date the twelfth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight in the words following; that is to say:

“We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty chapter seventy of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of your Majesty chapter ninety-seven of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter fifty-five and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of your Majesty chapter eighty-two have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Mark situate at Heyside in the new parish of Royton in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester.

“Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of Royton and of the new parish of Saint Stephen and All Martyrs Lower Moor in the said county of Lancaster and in the said diocese of Manchester which said extremities lie contiguous one to another and are described in the schedule hereunder written there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such respective new parishes.

“And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said new parish of Royton and of the said new parish of Saint Stephen and All Martyrs Lower Moor

should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Mark situate at Heyside as aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend James Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester as such Bishop and also as one of the patrons of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Stephen and All Martyrs Lower Moor with the consent of Hilton Greaves of Oldham in the said county of Lancaster Esquire of Thomas Hibbert Radcliffe of Oldham aforesaid Esquire and of Robert Stott of Oldham aforesaid Esquire as the remaining patrons of the said vicarage of the new parish of Saint Stephen and All Martyrs Lower Moor and with the consent of the Reverend Henry Mildred Birch a Canon of the Cathedral Church of Ripon and rector or incumbent of the rectory of the parish of Prestwich in the said diocese of Manchester as the patron (in right of his rectory or incumbency) of the vicarage of the said new parish of Royton (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of Royton and of the said new parish of Saint Stephen and All Martyrs Lower Moor which are described in the schedule hereunder written all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Mark situate at Heyside as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Mark Heyside.'

"We therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration and to make such Order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Mark Heyside being :—

HER Majesty's Ambassador at Paris has transmitted to the Marquis of Salisbury an extract from the French Journal Officiel, containing a Law which re-establishes the duties in the French Customs Tariff, which, as stated in the notice published in the London Gazette of the 17th of January, had been modified in consequence of the lapse of the Commercial Treaty of December 11, 1866, between France and Austria at the end of last year. The duty on woollen yarns, single, bleached or unbleached, measuring 20,000 metres or less to the kilogramme, which was fixed by the Franco-Austrian Treaty at 10 frs., 15 frs., or 20 frs. per 100 kilogrammes, according to the fineness, is, however, not re-established, but remains at 25 frs. per 100 kilogrammes. The French Minister of Finance is authorised in certain cases to repay to importers of goods affected by these changes of tariff the difference between the duties levied before and subsequent to the 31st of December, 1878, namely, on proof that such goods are the produce of a country having a Commercial Treaty with France, and were imported in execution of contracts entered into before the 1st of January, 1879.

The French Law above referred to is followed by a Decree of the President of the Republic, containing regulations relative to the exemption from Customs' duty under the 2nd Article of that Law, in favour of materials for building, equipping, or repairing merchant ships.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Bucharest, reporting that during the return to Russia of the Russian armies now in Bulgaria, which is to be effected by way of the Dobroutcha, the following sanitary measures are to be observed.

A sanitary cordon is to be maintained along the River Pruth to its confluence with the Danube, and along the latter river as far as Verciorova.

A sanitary cordon is to be established along the Danubian, Black Sea, and land frontiers of the Dobroutcha.

The above measures will be carried into effect subject to understandings to be come to with the heads of the Russian army staff.

Travellers and goods leaving the Dobroutcha for Roumania will be subjected to sanitary inspection and possibly to quarantine.

Russian vessels going up or down the Danube and wishing to touch at the left bank will be subjected to sanitary inspection and possibly to quarantine.

The following places are left open for free communication, viz. :—

On the Danube:—Galatz, Braila, Corabia, Beket, Calafat, Oltenita, Calarasi, Guirgiu, Zimnicea, Turno Magurelle, and Severin.

In the Dobroutcha:—Tulcea and Soulina.

Soulina is to be isolated by a sanitary cordon from the rest of the Dobroutcha.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs information to the effect that the Constantinople Board of Health have classed susceptible goods coming from Russia, and which are subjected to disinfection in lazarettos, in two categories.

The first category includes unwrought wool, cotton, furs, bedding, used linen, old clothes and the like, rags, skins, horsehair, leather, and animal products. These articles are subjected to fifteen days' quarantine, accompanied by the disinfecting process prescribed against plague.

The second category includes the casings made of susceptible material which enclose non-susceptible goods, such as bags or packing-cases made of linen or other stuffs, and any object the surface of which might harbour infectious germs. All such articles are subjected to five days' quarantine in lazarettos, accompanied by the external disinfection prescribed against plague.
