THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a translation of an Order of the Austrian Government respecting quarantine, which is as follows:—

ORDER of the Ministries of the Interior, of Finance, and of Commerce, dated the 8th April, 1879, respecting the restriction of the prohibition of Importation and Transit of Goods enacted against Russia by the Order of 1st February, 1879, with reference to the danger of Plague.

The Order of the Ministries of the Interior, of Finance, and of Commerce, dated 1st February, 1879, respecting the prohibition of importation and transit from Russia of several kinds of goods is, in accordance with the understanding come to with the Royal Hungarian Government, rescinded, except as regards the prohibition of importation and transit of worn body and bed linen, worn clothes, and rags of all kinds, which remains in force until further notice.

The prohibition of the importation and transit of bed feathers, published by the Order of the Ministries of the Interior, of Finance, and of Commerce of 7th June, 1878, and, with reference only to the German Empire, rescinded by the Order of the 1st of February, 1879, is put out of

operation for all the frontiers of the whole Austro-Hungarian, as well as the Dalmatian, Customs' territory.

The present Order comes into force on the day of its publication.
