**TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.**

1. THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England, on Tuesday, the 6th proximo, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Act 40 Vic., cap. 2, to the amount of £1,000,000.

WHEREAS the population of the parish of Saint Austell, in the county of Cornwall, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons ;

And whereas at a Meeting of the Vestry of the said parish, held, pursuant to public notice in that behalf, on Thursday, the 20th day of February, 1879, it was resolved,—
