#### REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

*By Her Majesty's Command,*

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

#### PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations should be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the

cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to his Royal Highness.

The State Apartments will be opened for the reception of Company coming to Court at one o'clock.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the ninth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, and shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the third day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, except as regards the recovery of any penalty incurred thereunder before that day; and words in this Order have the same meaning as in The Foreign Animals Order.

2. Notwithstanding anything in The Foreign Animals Order or in any other Order of Council, cattle brought from the United States of America to the Port of London may be transhipped in the Millwall Docks from the vessel in which they are brought to another vessel for conveyance to the foreign animals wharf, known as the Foreign Cattle Market at Deptford, subject to the following conditions:

*First.* That the vessel into which the cattle are transhipped be a vessel propelled by steam power (in this Order called the steamer).

*Second.* That the owner, agent, or charterer of the steamer has received the special permission of the Commissioners of Customs so to employ the steamer under this Order.

3. Those cattle shall be transhipped in the presence and under the supervision and control of an Officer of Customs, who shall remain in charge

of the cattle on board the steamer until its arrival at the Foreign Cattle Market at Deptford.

4. The steamer shall proceed direct to that market, and the cattle shall be landed there in the presence and under the supervision and control of an Officer of Customs.

5. The steamer shall, immediately after each occasion of use, be cleansed and disinfected in manner provided respecting vessels by Article 5 of The Cleansing and Disinfection Order of 1878.

6. Cattle so transhipped shall continue to be deemed foreign cattle.

7. If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of any of the provisions of this Order, the owner or consignee of the cattle, and the owner and the master of the steamer, and the company owning the Millwall Docks, shall each be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

3. Article 13 of The Foreign Animals Order is hereby further revoked as far as it relates to swine brought from the United States of America and declares that the same may be landed without being subject under the Act of 1878 or under that Order to slaughter or to quarantine.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant and appropriate out of our common fund to the vicarage of Saint Matthew, Chadderton, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester, one capital sum of five hundred pounds sterling, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of providing a parsonage or house of residence for the said vicarage, according to plans and a specification approved or to be approved by us, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of three pounds per centum per annum, and such interest to be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage of Saint Matthew, Chadderton: Provided always, that the said capital sum of five hundred pounds sterling, expressed to be hereby granted and appropriated to the said vicarage shall be, and be taken to be, in lieu of, and in substitution for, the yearly sum or stipend of sixteen pounds thirteen shillings and four pence, heretofore payable by us, the said Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage of Saint Matthew, Chadderton, under the authority of an instrument sealed by us on the second day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and published in the London Gazette of the tenth day of the same month and year.

In witness whereof, we have hereunto set our common seal, this first day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction of one hundred and fifty pounds sterling, which has been paid to us in favour of the vicarage of Saint Mary, Luddenden Foot, in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon, and in respect of which we have agreed to pay to the Incumbent of the same vicarage, and to his successors, a yearly sum of five pounds, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and

eleven, section five, grant to the Incumbent of the said vicarage of Saint Mary, Luddenden Foot, and to his successors, to meet such benefaction, one other yearly sum or stipend of five pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the day of the publication of these presents in the London Gazette, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions, on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient, in our opinion, to produce the yearly sum or stipend, so payable out of our common fund, as lastly herein mentioned, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said vicarage, in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.
