And whereas on such representation and consideration it appears to me that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the times for the holding of the said Fairs should be altered as proposed:

Now, therefore, I, as the Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Fairs Act, 1873," do hereby order that the Fairs which have been annually held on the 4th and 5th days of May and on the 22nd and 23rd days of November respectively, in the borough of Guildford, shall in future be held on or during a less number of days than those on which such Fairs are used to be held; and that such Fairs shall be held in the one case on the 4th day of May, and, in the other case, on the 22nd day of November (except when the day for holding a Fair falls on a Sunday, in which case the Fair shall be held on the following day), and on those days only in each year.

NOTICE is hereby given to the Officers, Seamen, and Marines, and to all persons interested therein, that the distribution of the tonnage and slave bounties awarded for the slave dhow, name unknown, and 35 slaves, captured on the 25th of September, 1878, by Her Majesty's ship "London," will commence on Friday, the 30th instant, in the Prize Branch of the Department of the "Accountant-General of the Navy and Comptroller of Navy Pay, Admiralty, New-street, Spring-gardens, S.W."

Agents and other persons holding powers of attorney, prize orders, assignments, or other instruments, by virtue of which they may be legally entitled to claim the share of any captor serving in the above-named ship, are requested to present the same at this office.

(enclosing his certificate of service, or an attested copy thereof, excepting in the case of Commissioned Officers),—in which letter his own place of residence is to be precisely stated, as well as the place of the nearest Collector of Customs, or of Inland Revenue, from whom it would be convenient to receive such share of prize money.
