#### REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

*By Her Majesty's Command,*

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

#### PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamber-

lain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations should be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to his Royal Highness.

**T**HE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of South Shields, in the county of Durham, as a foreign animals wharf :

All that space in the port and borough of South Shields being a part of the Tyne Dock property of the North Eastern Railway Company and

situate between the Tyne Dock and the road leading from South Shields to Tyne Dock and called Slake Row, inclosed in a line commencing at the water on the timber discharging jetty on the eastern side of the said Dock at a point two hundred and seven feet south-west of the south-west corner of the Jarrow Chemical Works, thence passing in an easterly direction for a distance of six hundred and forty-six feet to the north-west corner of the building called the Sanatorium or Lairs and bounded by a wooden fence, thence in a northerly direction for a distance of thirty-six feet bounded by the western wooden fence of the slaughter-house yard, thence in a south-easterly direction for a distance of thirty-six feet bounded by the north-eastern stone wall of the slaughter-house yard and the slaughter-house, thence in a southerly direction for a distance of one hundred and eighty-three feet and bounded by the east stone wall of the slaughter-house and the said Sanatorium or Lair, thence in a westerly direction for a distance of thirty-two feet bounded by the south wooden wall of the said Sanatorium or Lair, thence in a northerly direction for a distance of one hundred and fifty-three feet bounded by the west wooden wall of the said Sanatorium or Lair and two wooden doors, thence in a westerly direction for a distance of six hundred and forty-six feet and bounded by a wooden fence and terminating at the water at the east side of the said Dock on the timber discharging jetty before mentioned at a point five feet south of the point of starting before mentioned, all which space is coloured pink on the plan of part of the Tyne Dock deposited at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Town Clerk of the borough of South Shields.

A cow-shed or byre, in the occupation of Robert Black, Dairyman, and situate at 14, Rutland-crescent, in the parish of Govan, in the county of Renfrew.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Notice issued by the Greek Government, from which it appears that, although the quarantine of 24 hours imposed in Greece on arrivals from the Sea of Azov and the Black Sea, including Sulina, has been withdrawn, pratique is only granted to vessels after the visit of a medical officer; and that the importation of rags from the above places and from Turkey in general is still prohibited.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Notice issued by the Italian Government, respecting the importation of rags, old clothes, and unwashed linen from Greece, of which the enclosed is a translation; viz. :—

ORDINANCE OF MARITIME HEALTH. No. 14.

IN view of the law relating to the public health of the 20th of March, 1865, Clause C, and the Ministerial Instructions of the 26th of December, 1871, and in view of the Ordinance of the 29th of April, 1878, No. 6.

Considering that the Greek Government has imposed a prohibition, which it causes to be rigorously observed on the importation of rags, old clothes, and unwashed linen from Turkey and from the Russian Ports of the Black Sea and Sea of Azoff. The Minister of the Interior decrees :

That the aforesaid Ordinance of the 29th of April, 1878, is revoked as regards rags, old clothes, and unwashed linen imported from Greece,

always observing Art. 182 of the above-mentioned instructions.

The Prefects of the Maritime Provinces of the kingdom are charged with carrying out the present Ordinance.

#### INCOME TAX.

Whereas Enoch Wedgwood, William Adams, Thomas Hughes, Joseph Alcock, William Woodall,

And whereas the said Clerk of the Peace did duly comply with the said requisition in every particular.

Now at the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace of our Lady the Queen holden in and for the county of Stafford, at Stafford, on Monday, the 7th day of April, in the year of our Lord 1879, the Justices of the Peace for the said county now here assembled upon a due consideration of the premises, and upon being satisfied that the said requisition has been duly complied with, and that all proper notices have been given in the manner and to the persons as required by the first mentioned Act or otherwise, do entertain the said proposal, and under and by virtue of the first-mentioned Act, and of all other Acts enabling them in this behalf, do hereby provisionally order, that the several parishes, townships, tithings, hamlets, and places hereinbefore mentioned shall constitute and become a highway district, to be called "The Wolstanton and Burslem Highway District."

## SOLDIERS' BALANCES UNCLAIMED.

IN pursuance of the "Regimental Debts Act, 1863," notice is hereby given, that Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department has available, for distribution amongst the Next of Kin or others entitled, the sum of money set opposite to the name of each of the deceased soldiers named in the list which is published with this notice in the London Gazette, and the "Army List," and is also to be seen at the Quarters of the several Staff Officers for the Pension Service and Brigade Depôts throughout the United Kingdom.

Applications from persons supposing themselves entitled as Next of Kin should be addressed by letter to "The Under-Secretary of State, War Office, London, S.W.," and marked outside "Soldier's Effects."

No application can be attended to which does not state the date and place of the soldier's birth, enlistment, and death, and the name of his regiment; his regimental number should also be stated if known.

Should these particulars furnished by the applicant not agree with the facts recorded on the War Office documents relating to the deceased soldier, the applicant will be so informed; but should they agree therewith, then within three calendar months the Secretary of State will furnish the applicant with the usual requirements needed for the proof of the alleged relationship.

The application must be authenticated by the signature of the applicant, and his name should be affixed in the presence of the clergyman, or one of the churchwardens of the parish, or a Justice of the Peace; the applicant's address, with the name of the post town, must also be clearly stated. No personal application can receive attention.

Further lists will from time to time be published, and therefore it will facilitate the applicant's inquiries to give the number and date of the notice in which the deceased soldier's name appeared.—EFFECTS, 1878-9.
