From the Imperial Camp before Mentz, July 26. The 22d Instant in the evening we opened our Trenches, without any hinderance from the Enemy, who were in some disorder that night, bocasioned by the Bombs which the Hessiens shottinto the Town from their Battery on the other fide for the Rhine, and which set several Houses on site. This 23d by break of day some of the Enemiss Horse came out to disturb our Workmen, but were quickly forced to rethe. They placed several small Field-pieces along the Counter carp, with which they fired upon our Workmen, and the young Prince Fredericke of Newbourg was unfortunately killed by a Shot from thence. At night the Trenches were relieved by 4000 Men, of which sood were of the Troops of Hanouer, and we advanced our Works very considerably; the Enemy often shewed themselves in small Parties, but presently retired again. The 24th, the Saxops posted themselves in the Monastery of the Carthusians; and we finished our Lines of Communication. The same day a person came out of the Town, and reported. That the Garison was composed of 6000 Men. At night, the Limenburgers relieved the Trenches with 4000 Men. The 25th, the Imperialists removed their Bridge higher up towards the Mill, and secured it with a Redoubt, and almost sinished two Batteries, one of 15, and the other of 25 Pieces of Cannon. We are told, that General Danewaldt is ordered to march, with 8000 Hossie to observe the Duke de Duriss, who continues encamped with the Forces under his Command near Neustade.

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From the Camp before Mentz, July 28. The Elector of Barania has, fince my last, joyned us with 10000 Men; and all the Saxon Forces are now on this fide the Rhine; aid yesterday three Regiments of Hesse likewise passed that River. The Enemy fired very smartly last night, and we shad 10 Men killed, and 30 wounded; we like two Attacks, that on the lest is carried on by the Imperialits and Lanciburgers, and the other on the right by the Saxons and Bavarians; and our Trenches are advanced within and Bavarians; and our Trenches are advanced within 130 Paces of the Counterfearp.
