The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the four hundred and tenth section of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," it is enacted that upon the completion of any new lighthouse, buoy, or beacon, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, fix such dues in respect thereof to be paid by the master or owner of every ship which passes the same or derives benefit therefrom as Her Majesty may deem reasonable, and may from time to time alter the amount of the said dues; and that such dues shall be paid and collected in the same manner, by the same means, and subject to the same conditions in, by, and subject to which the light dues authorized to be levied by the said Act are paid and collected:

And whereas the Corporation of Trinity House of Deptford Strond have erected a new lighthouse on Bull Point, on the north coast of the county of Devon, and a light is already exhibited therefrom:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct that from and after the date of the present Order there shall be paid in respect of the said lighthouse for every vessel, whether British or foreign, which may pass or derive benefit from such light the toll of three-sixteenths of a penny per ton of the burden of every such vessel for each time of passing or deriving benefit therefrom if on an oversea voyage, and one-sixteenth of a penny per ton of the burden of every such vessel for each time of passing or deriving benefit therefrom if on a coasting voyage.

The said tolls shall be levied by the general lighthouse authorities, subject to the regulations and exemptions contained in the New Consolidated Tables of Light Dues sanctioned by Orders in Council dated respectively the twenty-fourth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, the sixteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, the twenty-first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and the seventeenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, and subject also to the gross abatement or discount of fifty-five per centum mentioned in the last-named Order.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five; and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Her Majesty, chapter eighty-two; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, in the words following; that is to say:

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of your Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, of the Act of

the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five; and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of your Majesty, chapter eighty-two; have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Stephen, situate at Burnley, in the new parish of Saint Paul, Lane Bridge within the original limits of the parish of Whalley in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of Saint Paul, Lane Bridge, and of the parochial chapelry of Burnley in the said county of Lancaster and in the said diocese of Manchester, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such new parish and parochial chapelry respectively.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said new parish of Saint Paul, Lane Bridge and of the said parochial chapelry of Burnley should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Stephen situate at Burnley as aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend James, Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester as such Bishop and also as one of the alternate patrons (in right of his See) of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Paul, Lane Bridge, with the consent of the Right Honourable Benjamin, Earl of Beaconsfield, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, the First Lord of your Majesty's Treasury, acting as such on behalf of your Majesty, as the other alternate patron (in right of the Crown) of the same vicarage, and with the consent of the Reverend Arthur Townley Parker, Clerk in Holy Orders, now Rector or Incumbent of the rectory of the said parochial chapelry of Burnley, as the patron of the same rectory (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would in our opinion, be expedient, that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of Saint Paul, Lane Bridge, and of the said parochial chapelry of Burnley which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Stephen situate at Burnley as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Stephen, Burnley.'

"We therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Stephen, Burnley, being:—

All that portion of the new parish of Saint Paul, Lane Bridge within the original limits of the parish of Whalley in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester which is bounded on the north-east by the parochial chapelry of Burnley on the south-east by the new parish of Saint John Holme, both within the original limits
